We have established a Yahoo Group named LincolnQuiltersGuild. We're trying to make it easier for Plain Print and other important messages to be sent out to LQG members.

Each person signed up to receive Plain Print by email will receive an email from PlainPrint@LincolnQuiltersGuild.org

It will have a link to click on that takes you straight to the LQG web site Newsletter page. You select the newsletter you want to print. Click on the link. It loads on Adobe Reader. You can read or print it.

IF YOU DID NOT RECEIVE YOUR PLAIN PRINT VIA THIS EMAIL METHOD, PLEASE EMAIL KATE at katequilt@yahoo.com AND LET HER KNOW.

DO NOT HIT THE REPLY BUTTON

We use the LQG Yahoo List as a tool to deliver mass emails to the guild members. An example would be the email to go download or read the Plain Print. Or the email reminder the week before guild.

If you are already receiving the emails, you are signed up. Sit back and relax. If you sign up for this at a future time, you should receive an email telling you that you have been added to the Yahoo group. IF you change your email, you must contact Kate (katequilt@yahoo.com) so your email address is changed on the list.

We have experienced a few problems in the past. First, if the email has an announcement and you want to contact that person, DO NOT hit the reply button. Cut and paste or type that person's email address into a new email form. Otherwise, if you just hit reply, your email goes to the LQG email (which is never checked) and it goes into Kate's inbox. It does not go to the person you wanted to contact.

One more thing. Emails that come from the Yahoo list will not be personal emails. The emails will contain general announcements for the guild. An example would be the reminder this summer about paying dues. My inbox and was stuffed and overflowing with emails wanting to saying things like "I paid, you need to double check your records". Mary's box was full too. And the LQG email box was full. This was not a good thing.


Due October/November Guild meetings
Block will be about 6 ½" after sewing (do not trim)

Fabric colors will be RED and BLACK. Please do not use any solids. Use tone on tone, small prints, or prints that read solid.


For each block cut: Two 3 ½" squares – black (background)

Two 3 ½" squares – red (bowtie)

Two 2" squares corner block - red (bowtie)




Lay each corner block (red) on each background square (black) right sides together. Sew through on the diagonal of the red corner block. You also can draw a line on the diagonal for a guide.




Trim the outside corner of the corner block (not the background). Fold the corner up over the seam allowance and press. The corners may not match the

background square and that's OK. Do not trim them. You'll use the background block to line up when sewing. *



Lay out your squares and sew them together.



The finished block will look like this. Remember to not size up the block. The winner will do that.
