Speaker: Linda Carlson

Roots of the Large 4-Block Quilt

This presentation explains the history and significance of the large 4-block quilt resulting from a research project I did involving 30 state quilt search projects and 108 museum collections. Antique and modern-made quilts are studied in the trunk show.

Since the early 1980s, Linda has taught all areas of quilting, specializing in hand appliqué, machine piecing, serpentine vines and feather borders, and Scherenschritte techniques. She is an authority on the history and techniques of the large four block quilt style. Linda and her twin sister, Diana Henage, combined their creative sides to design three collections of fabrics for Benartex that are

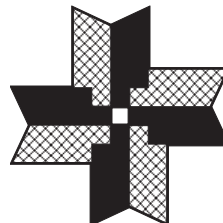

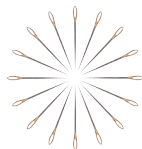

Since the original donation of the Ardis and Robert James Collection in 1997 and the establishment of the International Quilt Study Center, Ardis remained actively informed of and involved in the workings of the center until her passing in July 2011. This exhibition will feature quilts donated in her honor by many of today's leading studio quilt artists.

Minutes of the Lincoln Quilters Guild - March 12, 2012

College View Seventh-Day Adventist Church - Lincoln, Nebraska

President Joyce Pope called the business meeting to order, thanked our speaker Linda Thieffoldt and welcomed everyone.

The proposed changes to the LQG Calendar Year were approved at our last meeting and now will necessitate some By-laws changes. You have a printout on your chair tonight showing what changes will be made and the changes will also be printed in the next issue of Plain Print. Please read the changes and be prepared to discuss and vote on them at our April meeting. The Board spent a lot of time on this so if you have any questions, please contact one of your board members.

The minutes of the February meeting were approved as printed in the *Plain Print*.

The Treasurer's Report was approved as printed in the *Plain Print* and will be remanded for audit.

Printouts of the proposed budget for the next fiscal year, including amounts needed for the extension of the Guild Year are on the chairs tonight. Joyce asked if there was any discussion (there wasn't any) and said the budget will be voted on at our next meeting. Joyce thanked our Treasurer and Treasurer Elect, Sherry Taylor and Christina Chapman for all of their work on the budget.

Joyce announced articles for the *Plain Print* are due this Wednesday, March 14.

Kate Laucomer for the Nominations Committee had the slate of officers come forward. They are: President, Sandy Anderson; VP, Vicky Skuodas; Treasurer, Christina Chapman; Secretary, Barb Caron; Pres. Elect, Linda Daiker; Co-Vice Presidents Elect, Sara Kenny and Mary Sedlak; and Treasurer Elect Marsha Conley. We will vote on officers at our next meeting. Joyce thanked the Nominating Committee for their work and the slate of officers for volunteering.

Joyce asked Sandy to come forward to read the announcements and asked the committee chairs with announcements that were not in the last Plain Print or will not be in the next Plain Print and committee chairs with approved announcements to be ready when Sandy is done.

Announcements – Sandy Anderson, President-elect:

We have 8 visitors who signed in tonight. Sandy asked that they stand to be recognized. Sandy said she hoped they had an enjoyable evening and will consider joining our guild.

We hope you will take them with you and leave them at your office, your husband's office, schools, restaurants, and wherever people might be. We want to get these bookmarks out and see them all over town. We want people to know about our show. Think about who you might personally invite to our show as we want people who will bid at our auction to be present. LQG Proposed Budget

The Finance Committee prepared the proposed budget to cover the short year (June 1, 2012 through November 30, 2012) and the regular year (December 1, 2012 through November 30, 2013) combined. We do not anticipate using any funds from savings to cover the transition period. This was achieved primarily by controlling certain program expenses. As the year progresses, some funds may need to be withdrawn from savings if necessary.

RECEIPTS NOTES:

- Funds are held in a basic business interest checking account at Union Bank and Trust Company earning .10%.
- Surplus Guild funds are held in a 10-month Access Certificate at Union Bank and Trust Company. Interest is paid quarterly and is applied to the certificate. As of 2/29/12, the interest rate was 0.2000%.
- There was no Bus Trip during 2011-2012. A bus trip is being planned in the Fall of 2012. No revenue funds are budgeted as it is a "self funding" (SF) project through participant fees. Any excess of revenue over expenses remains in the guild's general fund.
- No revenue is budgeted for the Cuddle Quilts project. It is listed because we received a donation designated for the project.
- No revenue is budgeted for the Fall Retreat activity as it is a SF activity through participant fees. Any excess of revenue over expenses remains in the guild's general fund.
- Membership dues will not increase and will cover both the short and regular fiscal year (June 1, 2012 through November 30, 2013). Members will gain three extra meetings with

- the transition period. We anticipate receiving \$4,000+ in dues in April and May for the next guild year, so we should be close to reaching budgeted amount.
- One-time, self-funded activity paid with participant fees. Will be eliminated as a line item in the budget.
- Twelve meetings/\$85.00 (Based on last year's average over 7 meetings [no mini raffle in Jan. 2011]).
- Includes income from the Guild's quilt exhibit at Sutton Eye Clinic, royalties from "Nebraska Quilts and Quiltmakers," and any donation not designated to a specific project/activity.
- No revenue is budgeted for this line item. With the closing of the IQSC Gift Shop we do not anticipate receiving much revenue for the quilt patterns.
- Advertising income is down this year primarily due to the economy. The projected amount is based on 2 advertisers/\$35.00/ad in 12 issues (September – November 2012 and March – November 2013).
- Workshops and classes are a major service of the guild and are essentially a self-funded activity. Registration fees are only meant to defray costs and not turn a profit. The projected amount is based on having 11

- workshops/classes in the next program year (there are 8 workshops/classes in the current program year).
- 14. Each quilt show nets approximately \$16,000.00 in revenue. Each show's revenue is to be used for the Guild's activities over the 24-month period following the show. The May 2010 quilt show revenue was used for the 12 months of the Guild year from June 1 – May 31, 2010 and for the 12 months of the year June 1, 2011 – May 31, 2012. The May 2012 quilt show will be used for the 6 months of the short transition year and the 12 months of our first regular year on the new schedule (December 1, 2013 – November 30, 2014), and the first 6 months of the following year. Note: Cash is not transferred from savings until needed.
- Is a SF project. We received \$192.80 from sock voting and \$40.00 in donations.
- One-time activity. Will be deleted as a line item in the budget.

Lincoln Quilters Guild Proposed Bylaws Changes

A proposal by the Lincoln Quilters Guild (LQG) Executive Board, changing the Guild's membership/fiscal year, was voted on and approved by a majority of the members present at the regular meeting of the Lincoln Quilters Guild held on February 13, 2012. As a result, amendments to the Guild's Bylaws need to be made accordingly to reflect the new membership/fiscal year. The wording to be amended is struck through and the new wording is underlined.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

We've never had so much activity on the museum's third floor! Quilts of Valor was our featured outreach project. Many blocks were signed and will be pieced into quilts for our returning service men and women.

As an extension to the contemporary quilts in the galleries, guests learned several surface design techniques: monoprinting, dyeing with markers and alcohol, quilt embellishments and curved piecing from UNL Graduate students and local fiber artists. Guests could sit and relax while

All members of Lincoln Quilters Guild are encouraged to consider exhibiting some of their work in the 2012 quilt show. The following guidelines will help members plan their entries and help Quilt Show volunteers with the proper display and return of items.

Please read carefully before completing registration form(s)!

- Exhibitors must be members of Lincoln Quilter Guild unless exhibiting by invitation of the Quilt Show Committee.
- Items must not have previously been shown in an LQG quilt show unless by invitation of the Quilt Show Committee.
- Show categories are:

General – This includes bed quilts (crib to king), wall hangings, throws, miniatures, table runner or toppers, art quilts, etc. The item must hang flat; no dolls, garments, handbags, etc. A limit of 4 entries in this category per member will be allowed. One series of up to 4 pieces will be allowed per member and will count as one item.

Challenge – “Take Something Old and Let It's Sparkle Out”

Quilts of Valor (QOV) Made according to QOV guidelines, these quilts will be donated to the QOV project after the show and **will not be returned to the maker.**

Young Quilt Artists – Quilts made by LPS Bryan Focus School students

Intergenerational Quilting - Limit of two per child; quilt project done predominately by the child with help of LQG member.

- A **separate** registration form must be completed for **each entry**.
- All entries must be finished projects; hanging sleeves are not necessary for quilt show entry.
- All entries must be clean, smoke and odor free.
- A label with the entrant's name and the name of the piece must be permanently attached to each quilt.
- The exhibitor is responsible for insurance on their entries.
- Items entered in the quilt show may be photographed as video and flash cameras are allowed at the quilt show.
- All quilts must remain on display for the duration of the show. Quilts will not be released until the entire show has been taken down.
- Registration will be done online. If you do not have online access, contact the registrar at 402-423-3863 or at the Quilt Show table during Guild meetings.
- Online registration deadline for Challenge items is **April 9th**. Challenge items must be turned in at the April Guild meeting (April 9th)

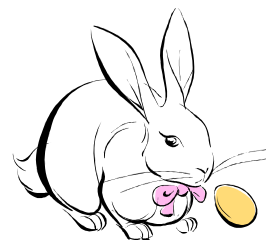

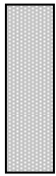

Spring 2012 • Friendship Block

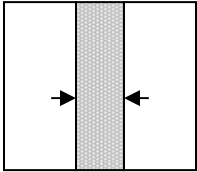
Pastel Rectangle Blocks

The blocks will be done in spring/pastel colored fabric.

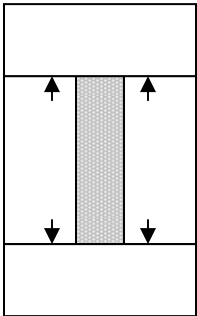
All the centers are green.



1. Cut strips of spring/pastel green fabric into 2 ½ inch strips. Sub-cut into a 2½ x 6½ inch strip for the center of each block.



2. Cut a 3 inch strip of a printed spring/pastel colored fabric (NOT GREEN). Sub-cut this strip into two 6 ½ inch strips. Sew a strip to each side of the center green fabric, right sides together, using a ¼ inch seam. The block will now measure 6½ x 7½ inches. Press the seams towards the green center. (Follow arrows.)



3. From the same 3 inch strip of spring/pastel fabric, sub-cut two 3 X 7 ½ inch strips. With right sides together, sew the strips to the top and bottom of the block, using a ¼ inch seam. Press these seams away from the center. (Follow arrows.)

4. **The block that is turned in will measure 7½ x 11½ inches.**

(Winners of the blocks may wish to trim the blocks to 6½ x 10½ inches, or to a uniform size. If the blocks are trimmed, remember to trim the same amount from the top and bottom, and the same amount from each side.)

*** Blocks will be turned in at the March and April Guild meetings. The drawing for the blocks will be at the April meeting. This finishes the Friendship Blocks for this Guild year.

Children "Quilt of Valor" blocks

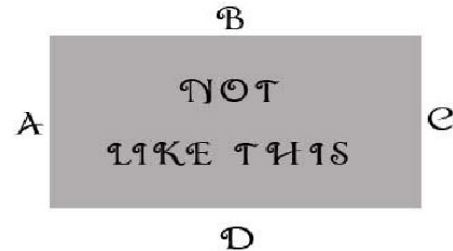
Children will have a chance to "sparkle" at our quilt show as they try their hand at sewing blocks and creating a Quilt of Valor. Each child will sew two three-strip blocks in the rail fence pattern out of red, white, and blue fabric. They will keep one for themselves and contribute one to our quilt of valor. Here's how you can help with this project.

We need contributions of pre-cut fabric strips in red, white or blue fabric. They should be cut 2½ x 6½ inches. You can bring these to the April or May meetings and put them at the show table or give them to Becky Haynes. We also need another sewing machine to use at the show that will simply sew straight seams AND we need volunteers to assist the children with their stitching.

Quilt Show 2012 Challenge

Take Something Old and Let It's Sparkle Out???
Take Something Old and Make Something New???

1. Mixed Media – Use what you have around the house!
2. There must be 3 layers:
A Top – it must include fabric
A Backing – it must include fabric
A Middle – batting and/or Timtex/Peltex
3. There must be hand or machine quilting holding the three layers together.



4. It may **NOT** be a regular rectangle (where sides A and C are one length and sides B and D are another length).
5. Width: 30" or less
Height: 30" or less

We're looking for different shaped quilts! These would all be good. So would circular!

- Think more or less than 4 sides!
- Batting on top of Peltex for middle
- (Peltex gives stability and batting, makes it feel like a quilt)

You can sign up for 1 to 3 hour shifts during the show hours – 10 am to 6:00 pm on Friday, Saturday or Sunday. This may be a good time to work on your own projects or make additional blocks for the children's quilt, as well.

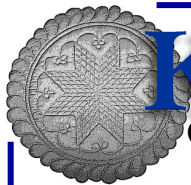

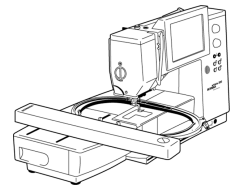
