Conversation revolved around the successful quilt show at Miller and Paine. Comments were made about the television show, "Quilting" on Saturday afternoons at 2:00 p.m. on Channel 12. A well-planned program, the last program was on Log Cabin pattern. The next 9:30 workshop will be at the home of Carol Caplan, 5201 Cameron Ct.

AFTERNOON: Afternoon workshop was held at Mary Ghormleys where we were greeted by a quilt hung on the porch. Approximately eleven members attended, some leaving early and some coming late after an extension craft luncheon. They brought very expertly crafted and a large variety of Christmas decorations--Eleanor Sindlar, Lou Lessman and Hetty Cole were the extension clubbers. Hazel Warren brought a beautiful pillow top made in the Dresden Plate design with silk ties and a navy background. Mary's table was beautiful and everyone had to have the delicious dessert recipe which Mary graciously shared. Mary showed us a great hint: she uses a small bottle of water and a cotton tipped stick to erase water soluble pen markings after she has quilted a design as she is quilting. Winnie Johnson was appliqueing her Christmas design of holly. Eunice Plucknett had several show and tells, a duck picture in applique etc. We all enjoyed meeting Helen--a quilter and a real doll!

RESOURCE: Cloth & Collectibles at 6224 Havelock Ave. has Regal Gold Eye Quilting Needles, 3,000 yd. spools of 100% cotton thread, 40 colors of mercerized cotton thread, size 50 in 325 yd. spools; Suisse & J.P. Coats quilting thread; Mountain Mist & Fairfield batting (cotton & traditional); and some coordinated 100% cotton fabrics. Props. Sue Volkmer & Diane Papenfuss.

GUILD LIBRARY TEMPLATE COLLECTION: Drunkard's Path, 2 pieces, makes 12" block. Dresden plate, curved top window, makes 14" block. 1", 1½", 2", 2½", 3", 3½", 4" square window. ¾", 1" ¼", 1½", 1 ¾", 2", 2½" hexagon window. 2", 2½", 3", 3½" 4", 45 degree right triangle window. 2", 2½", 3" 45 degree diamond window. 2", 2½", 3", 3½", 4" 60 degree diamond window. See Imagean Lind.
