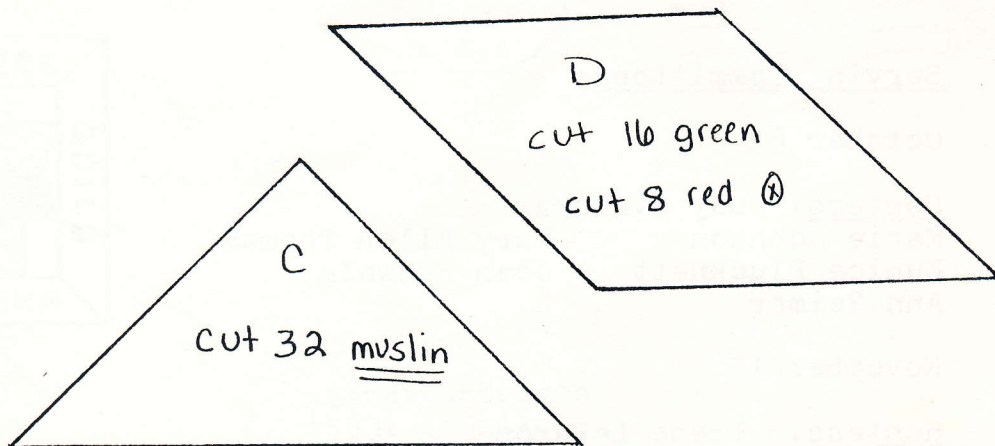
Friendship Block Exchange.....

- At two times this next year a pattern will be printed in the newsletter.
- Each person who wishes to participate, make a block as directed.
- Fabrics should be 100% cotton, if possible or a blend with a high percent of cotton(50%-50%).
- Each person who brings a block to the meeting will be eligible to put their name in for a drawing.
- The first set of 12 blocks will equal one quilt--therefore if 36 blocks are entered, there will be 3 people who win.
- Each person is eligible to win once per year. Therefore, if a person makes three blocks her name can be entered three times but is only eligible to win once.
- If you wish to make a block but do not wish to be in the drawing, that is fine but you cannot be in the drawing if you don't make a block.

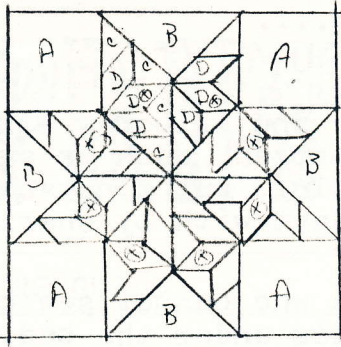

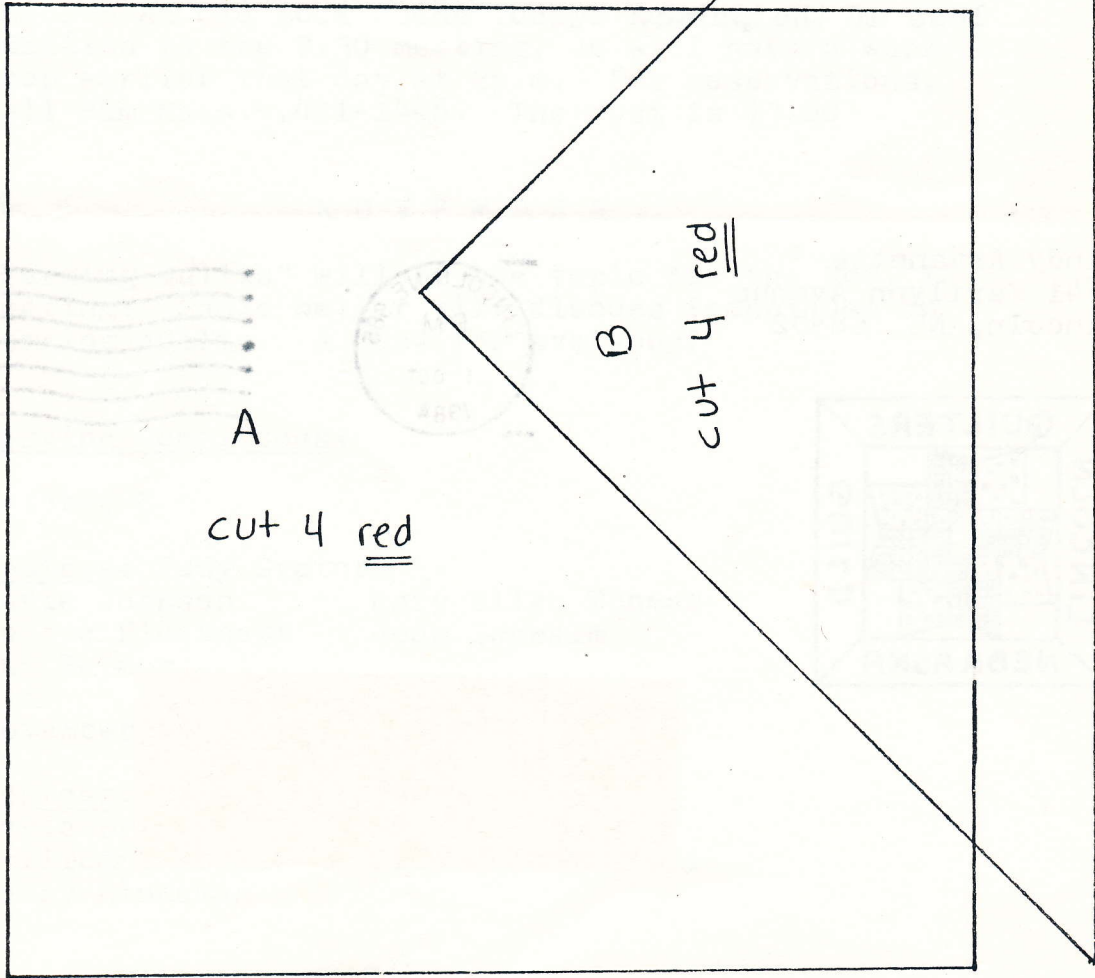
