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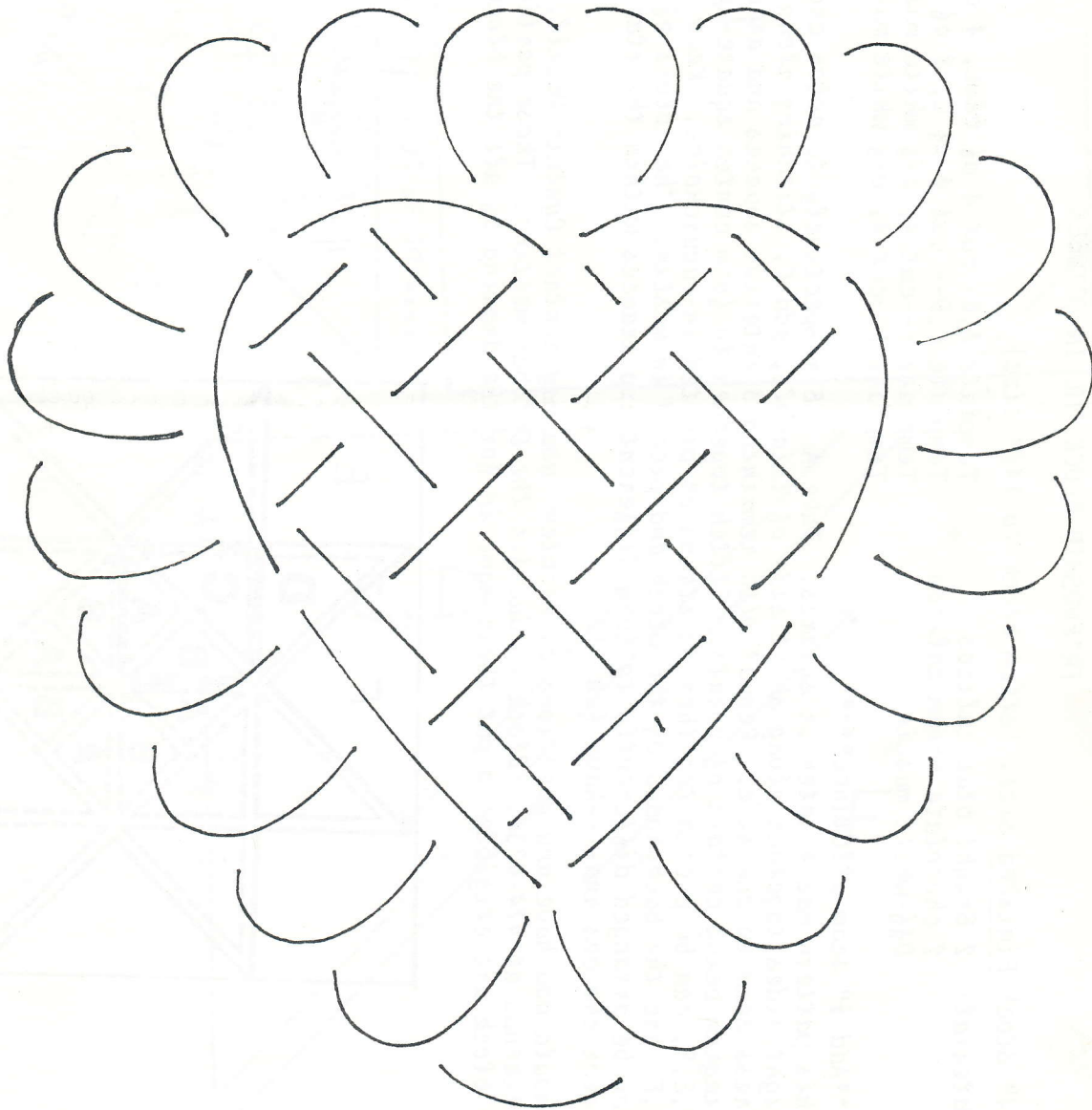
NEBRASKA QUILT PROJECT

For those you that are collectors of quilting designs, add this one to your library!!!! This is best centered on a 6" square or may be used for a 7" as well. Remember this as an addition to your next project, where space is abundant.



MARTHA WASHINGTON STAR  
FRIENDSHIP BLOCK DUE IN OCTOBER

14" Block Finished size, (steam block to 14½" size)

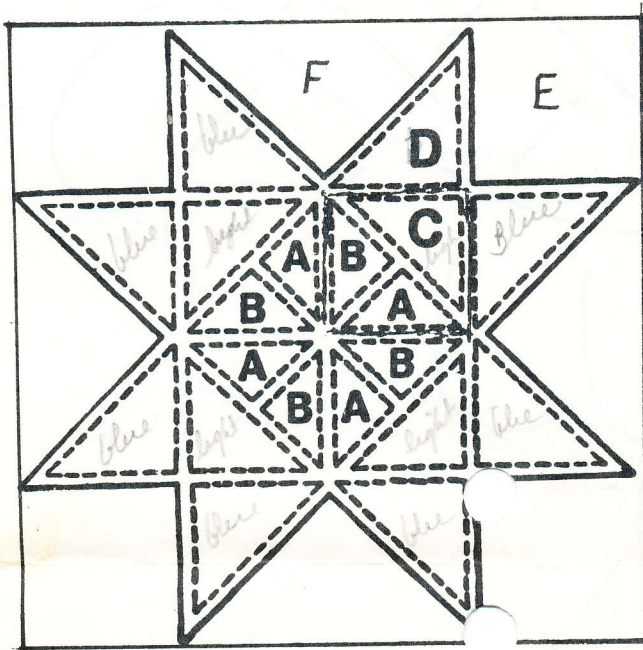
Material: 2 Bright blue calicos  
2 chocolate brown calicos  
Off-white muslin

Template A,B--cut 4 of blue, 4 of brown  
Template C,D-- cut 4 of C, 8 of D  
Template E--cut 4, off white muslin  
Template F--cut 4, off white muslin

\*\*\*Add ¼" seam allowance\*\*\*\*\*

This pattern has 4 interior squares. Take A & B respectively to color choice, stitch with right sides together along short side of triangle, add C, stitching along long side of triangle. Press seam to one side. Repeat with remaining 3 interior squares and arrange squares as in diagram being certain of points. Stitch together to form center square--press. Templates D,E,F, can be pieced together in strips or pivoted in--yourchoice. Keep in mind template E,F, are the background of the block and pieced in muslin. The colors of blue and brown can be arranged differently to form different appearances within the star. Play with your color choices and---have fun!!!!

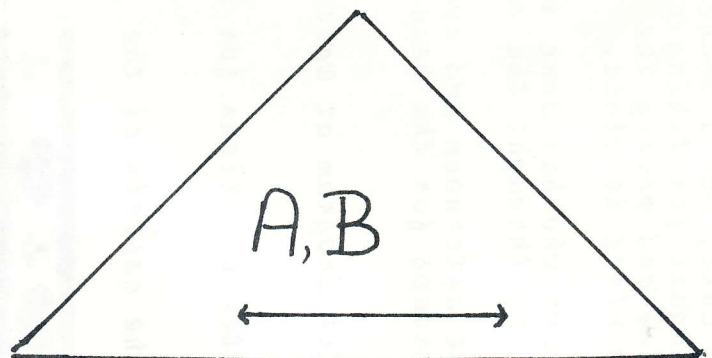
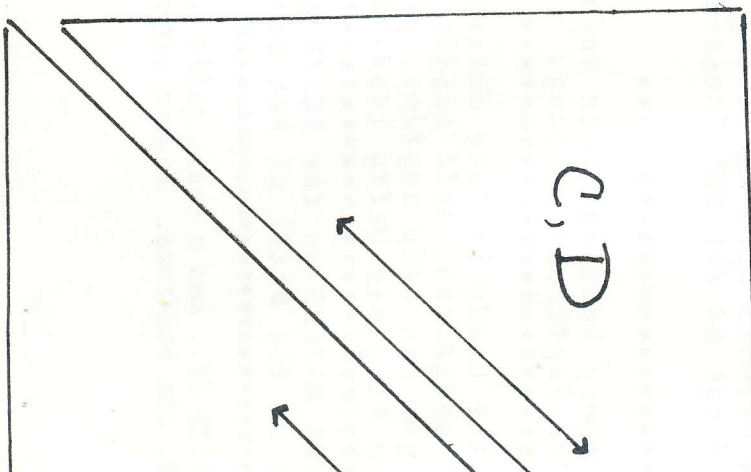

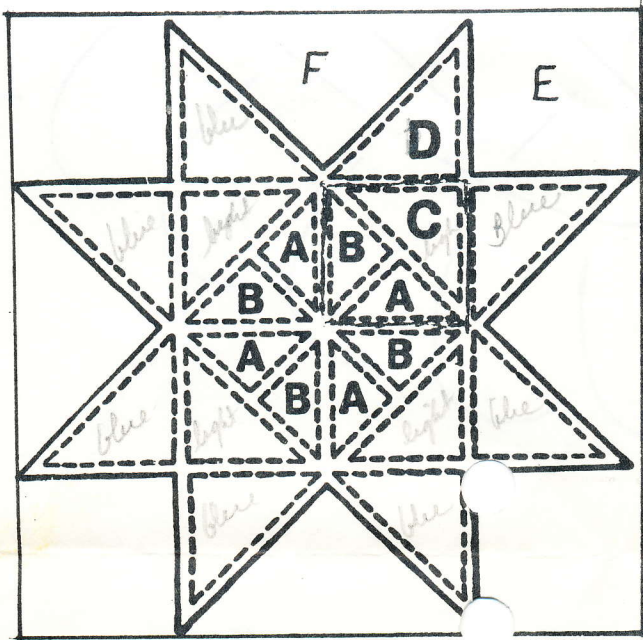
C-4 light

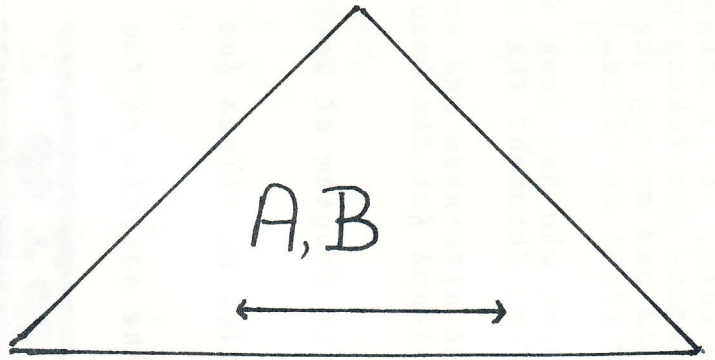
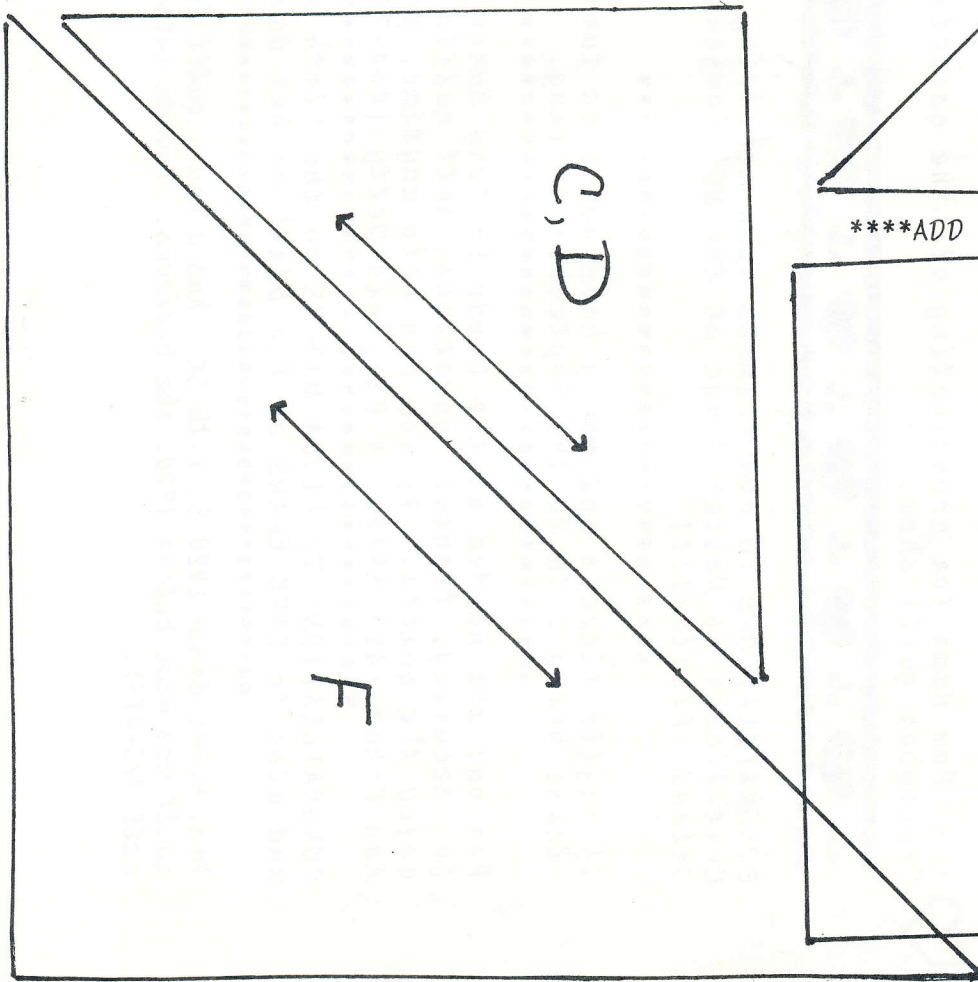




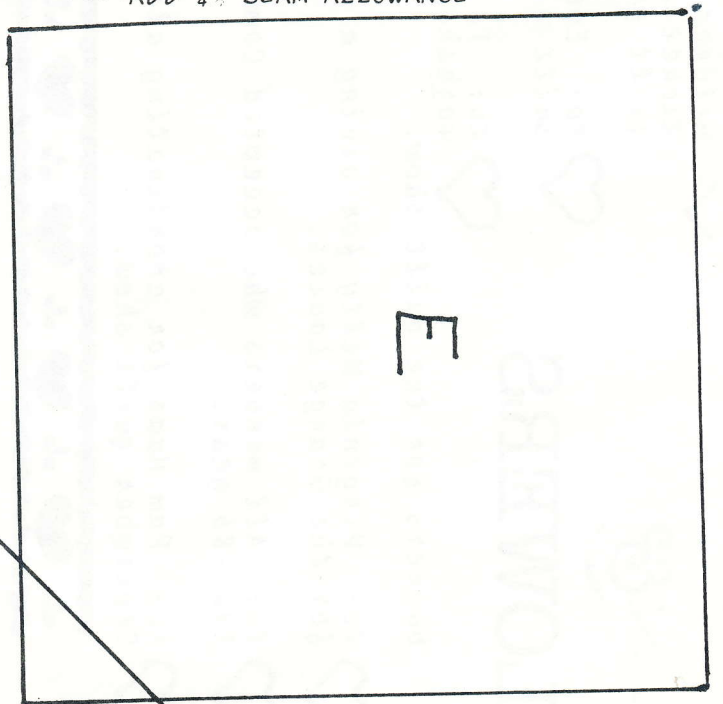

TEXTILE BLEACHING RECIPE  
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This recipe is from the Valentine Museum in Richmond, Virginia and also from Marion Scouler, a student of the Royal School of Needle-Artists in London.

2 parts of Ivory Snow detergent  
1 part of Snowy Bleach  
Warm Water

Soak your linens or vintage textiles with this solution in a large receptacle. Squeeze. Hand laundry, and RINSE....RINSE....RINSE.. RINSE.....UNTIL YOU COULD DRINK THE RINSE WATER!!!!

Scoop items up in a plastic container, giving support to the fabric that is heavy with the weight of water.

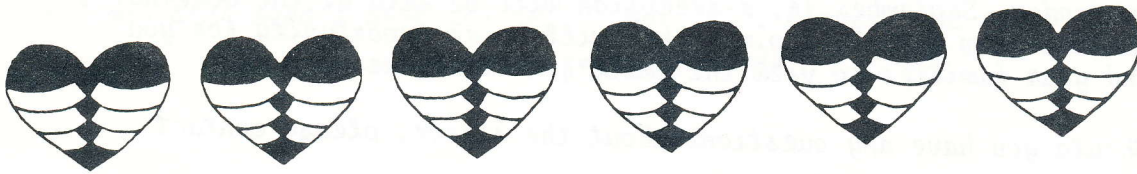
Roll in a large towel or beach towel. Lay on the lawn in the shade to dry!!!!

If you have quilt(s) to be hung in the show, please deliver to Hope Partridge, 3035 Kucera on September 11th and by noon on the 12th. The quilts will be hung on Friday, and time for pick-up will be given by Hope upon delivery.

Before delivering your quilt, please attach a sleeve to the back, on the side you want the quilt hung from. This should be a 6" deep sleeve to extend across the side, leaving 2" short of both edges of the quilt. Slip stitch both the top and bottom of the sleeve.

On Monday, September 16, a reception will be held at the Governor's Mansion from 5:00-7:00 p.m. This will be an opportunity for you and your families to view the small quilts at the Mansion.

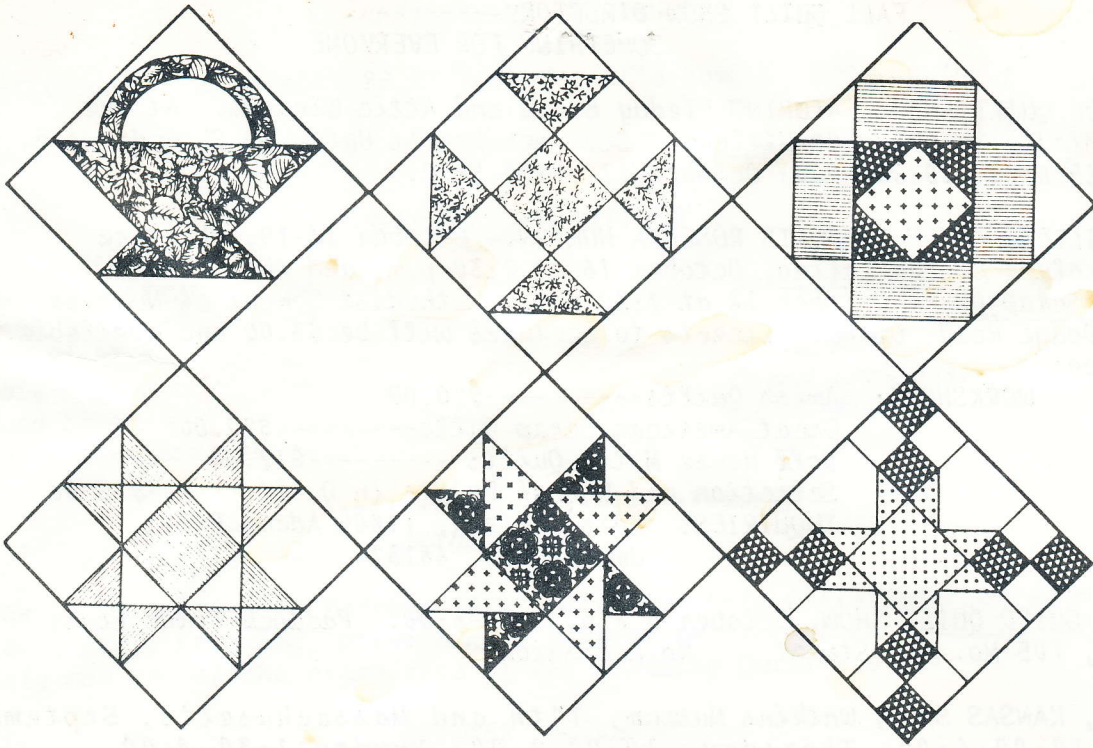

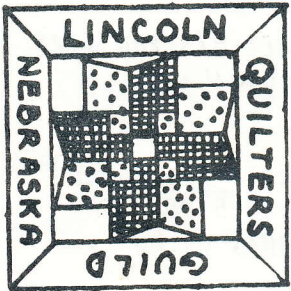
