Millie Fauquets wallhanging "Autumn Flight" was first place winner in the pieced and appliqued division of The Dogwood Arts Festival and Smoky Mountain Quilt Show and Competition April 12-20, Knoxville, TN.

My "Delectable Star" wall hanging (measures 38 1/2" square) was lost or stolen by UPS on or about March 21, 1991. It was to be delivered to a show in Lancaster, PA. This wall hanging won Best Overall Non-Functional Item and the LQG Award at the 1990 Nebraska State Fair, so you may be familiar with it.

It is a rusty maroon floral print and muslin. The center is a large feathered star block, surrounded by 2 floral strips, and the border is made up of 4 delectable mountain blocks on each side.

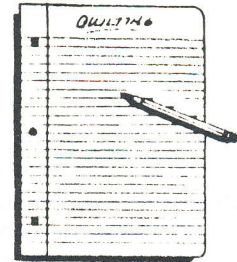

Also, if you signed up to buy an NQA hostess apron, please call Judy. The cost for the apron is \$3.00. Mugs and aprons are waiting to be claimed!

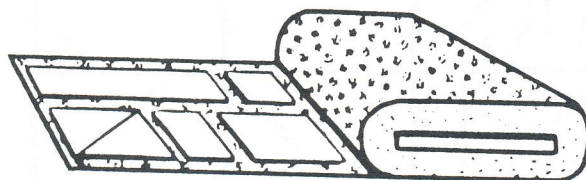
Several items from the NQA show are in a lost and found box. We will bring the box to the September guild meeting in hopes of finding owners for these things.

The September Friendship Block is the Friendship Star. Use muslin for the star and a dark fabric for the rest of the block. Finished size is 6" with a 1/4" seam allowance on each side. For the 2" square pieces, you need one muslin and 4 of a dark fabric. For the triangles, cut 4 muslin and 4 dark fabric.

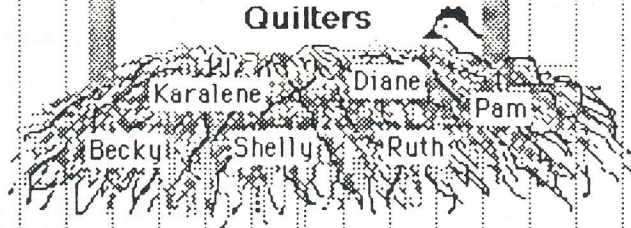

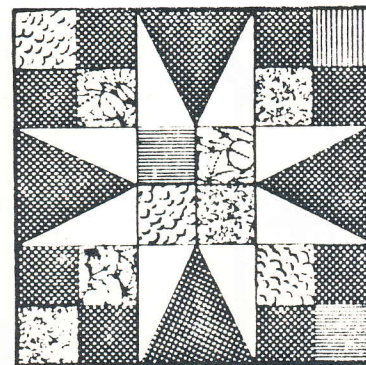


