Philomena Durcan will be the featured speaker at the March Guild meeting. She introduced Celtic design to the quilt world in 1980 with the publication of her first book, "Celtic Quilt Designs." Since then she has lectured and given workshops throughout the world on her Interlace, Spiral, and Floral designs. Her work has been exhibited internationally in numerous museums and shows, and she has been featured in quilting magazines and television shows. Her lecture, "Color In My Quilts" is a visual narrative of her work from the beginning struggles with color to later successes. Since the study of color is a process, Philomena will share her thoughts on the process of risk and success. Her lecture is meant to be inspirational and to give encouragement to quilters who have questions about color. Philomena is originally from County Sligo, Ireland, where she was greatly influenced by her mother, a lace maker. She has since combined her Irish heritage with her designs and needlework skills to develop a new and unique concept of fabric art. She lives in the San Francisco Bay area where she continues to teach and to explore new horizons in Celtic design.

Philomena will teach a "Celtic Interlace" class on Tuesday, March 9, at the All Saints Lutheran Church (8251 Pioneers). Interlace is one of the most important Celtic art forms. This class attempts to preserve this ancient and beautiful tradition. The student will have a hands-on experience in learning the basic techniques of Celtic Bias Applique. The students will become familiar with the under and

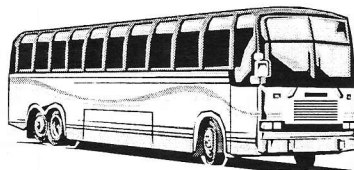

Four rotations of quilts will be available to viewers over a two-year period, with each rotation featuring 16 quilts.

The lasting legacy of frontier quiltmakers is celebrated in Patchwork Lives, a quilt exhibition assembled from the collections of the International Quilt Study Center (IQSC) and the Nebraska State Historical Society (NSHS). Patchwork Lives provides a unique vision of the women who established their lives on the Great Plains - raising families, giving moral and spiritual guidance, working to support the family in jobs both at home and in professional capacities and supporting political and social causes. The quilts of Patchwork Lives provide examples of how women established structure and celebrated beauty in the midst of enormous and over-whelming change.

For pioneer women and succeeding generations, quilts provided warm bedding, but also served as a means of self-expression through which hopes, memories, and beliefs were communicated. Quilts expressed personal stories of triumph and loss, announced political views and acted as triggers for memories of people or events. Patterns were found in farm magazines, women's magazines and newspapers and were often shared among family and friends. Yet individual artistry can be seen in the choice of materials, arrangement of color and skill of piecing. The resourcefulness and imagination of frontier quiltmakers is celebrated in Patchwork Lives.

On April 15th, 2004 a Brown Bag lecture by guest curator of Patchwork Lives, Stephanie Whitson, will be hosted by the NSHS. The lecture is scheduled for noon in the Blackman Auditorium at the Museum of Nebraska History, 15th & P Streets in Lincoln, Nebraska. There is no admission charge. The lecture will also be broadcast on Lincoln Cablevision, Channel 5, in May. The show will air on Wednesdays at noon and 8:30 p.m., on Fridays at 5 p.m., and Saturdays at 6 p.m.

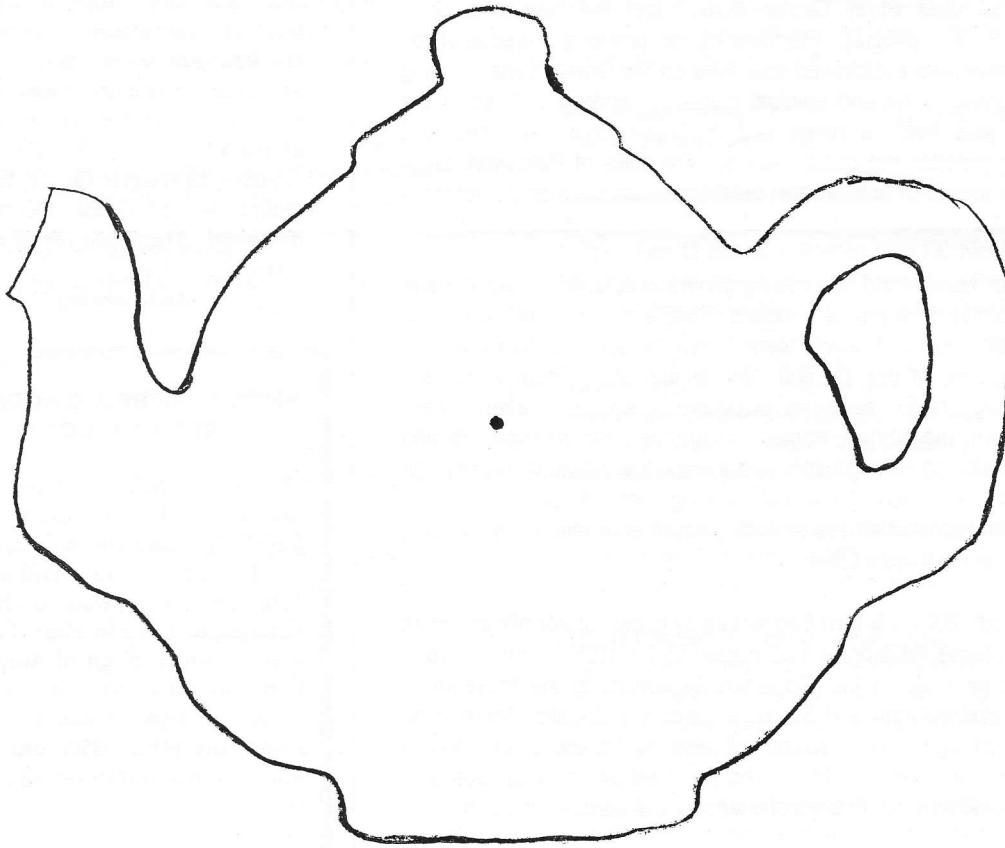

"TEA PARTY"

8" Finished

Appliqué teapot (use pretty floral print fabric) on a 8 1/2" light background fabric square. Use a small print or tone-on-tone light color fabric for background square. Used dot on teapot appliqué pattern to center teapot on background square. To find center of background square, fold square in half, and then in half again.

This year's Quilter's Tea will feature a lecture discussing the highlights of the IQSC's latest addition to the collection, the Jonathan Holstein Collection, that includes stunning classic Amish quilts from Lancaster, Pennsylvania, dynamic pieced quilts and the entire group of the pivotal exhibition, Abstract Design in American Quilts. This group was shown at the Whitney Museum in New York City, in 1971, and is credited with helping to launch the quilt revival of the 1970's. It also inspired local quilters to launch their own quilt events, including an exhibit at the Sheldon Memorial Art Gallery and a symposium, Fine Art/Folk Art held at Wesleyan University in 1977.

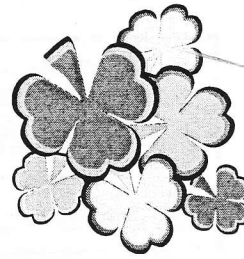

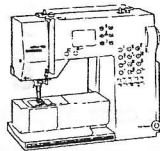
