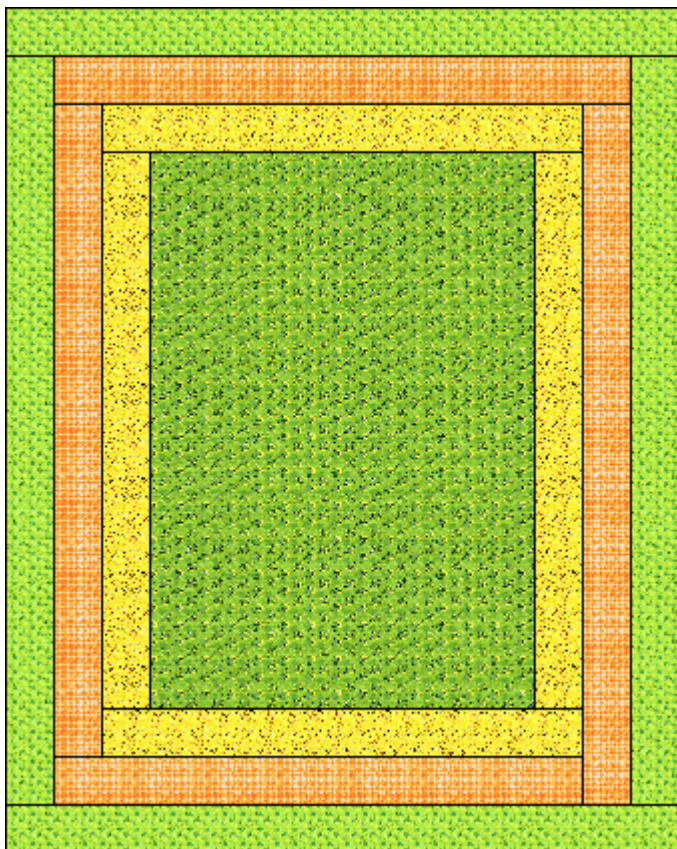


## Juvenile Jinx – 70" x 88"

PLEASE read all directions before starting



### Materials for large quilt (shown above):

- 1 ¾ yd. juvenile fabric
- 1¼ yd. inside border fabric
- 1-3/8 yd. middle border fabric
- 2 ¼ yd. outside border & binding fabric
- twin batt
- 5½ yd. backing fabric
- ½ yd. binding fabric \*

\* more for bias binding

1. Cut 40½" x 58½" rectangle from juvenile fabric.

### From inside border fabric:

2. Cut 7 strips 5½" x width of fabric.
3. Sew 2 strips together on short end. Repeat with 2 more strips.

From these sewn strips, cut 2 strips 58½" long. Sew to right and left edges of center rectangle.

Press seam allowance behind borders.

4. Sew remaining 3 strips together. From this long strip, cut 2 strips 50½" long. Sew to top and bottom edges of center. Press seam allowance behind borders.

### From middle border fabric:

5. Cut 8 strips 5½" x width of fabric.
6. Sew 2 strips together on short edge. Repeat with 2 more strips. Repeat until you have 4 sets of strips.
7. Measure through center of quilt from top edge to bottom edge. Cut 2 strips the length you measured from sewn strips made in step 6. Sew to right and left edges of quilt. Press seam allowance behind border.
8. Measure through center of quilt from left edge to right edge. Cut 2 strips the length you measured from sewn strips made in step 6. Sew to top and bottom edges of quilt. Press seam allowance behind border.

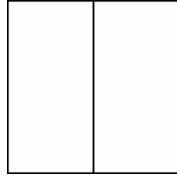
### From outside border fabric:

9. Cut 4 – 5½" strips down length of fabric.
10. Measure through center of quilt from top edge to bottom edge. Cut 2 strips the length you measured from long strips cut in step 9. Sew to right and left edges of quilt.
11. Measure through center of quilt from left to right edge. Cut 2 strips the length you measured from the long strips cut in step 10. Sew to top and bottom edges of quilt.

12. Cut backing fabric in 2 equal pieces.

Sew together down one long edge.

Seam will be vertical when you layer quilt.



13. Layer:

backing (right side down)

batting

top (right side up)

Baste.

14. Quilt as desired.

15. Cut 8 – 2” strips for binding.

Sew together into one continuous strip.

Press seam allowances open.

Fold binding in half (meeting long edges) with wrong side in. Press.

16. Sew binding to quilt.

Hand stitch binding to back of quilt.

17. Cut a 3” x 4½” rectangle from muslin or white fabric (plain is best). Press under ½” on all edges. Stitch to the back of the cuddle quilt. That’s it. You don’t have to write anything on it. When Anita gets your finished cuddle quilt, she’ll stamp on your muslin label. She has a stamp that puts all of the LQG information on the label.
