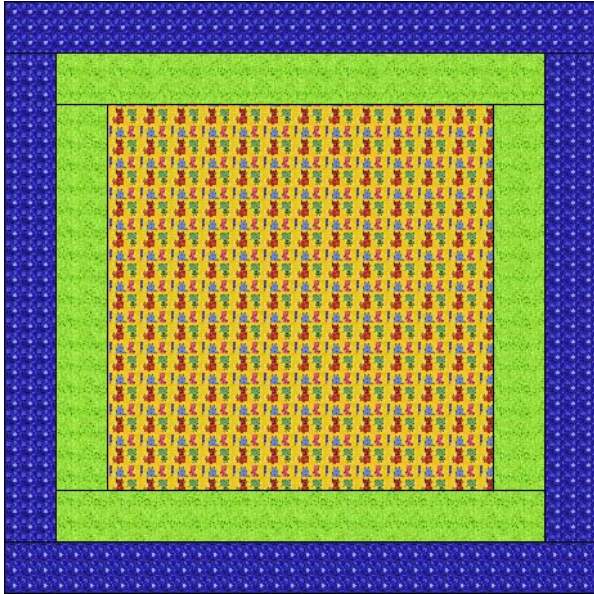


Juvenile Jinx – 40" square

PLEASE read all directions before starting



Materials for large quilt (shown above):

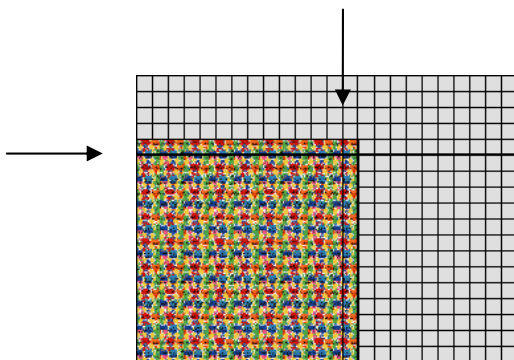
- 7/8 yd. juvenile fabric
- 1/2 yd. inside border fabric
- 1/2 yd. outside border fabric
- 1/3 yd. binding fabric*
- crib batt
- 45" x 45" piece backing fabric

* more if making bias binding

1. Cut 26 1/2" square from juvenile fabric.

NOTE: if you are having difficulty cutting this large a square, fold fabric in fourths.

Place folded edges on "0" line - vertical and horizontal. (Folds in picture are on left and bottom.)



Trim right edge lining up ruler so you cut on 13 1/4".

Trim top edge the same way cutting at 13 1/4".

From inside border fabric:

2. Cut 2 strips 4" x 26 1/2".
Sew to right and left edges.
Press seam allowance behind borders.
3. Cut 2 strips 4" x 33 1/2".
Sew to top and bottom edges.
Press seam allowance behind borders.

From outside border fabric:

4. Cut 2 strips 4" x 33 1/2".
Sew to right and left edges.
Press seam allowance behind borders.
5. Cut 2 strips 4" x 40 1/2".
Sew to top and bottom edges.
Press seam allowance behind borders.

6. Layer:
 - backing (right side down)
 - batting
 - top (right side up)

Baste.

7. Quilt as desired.
8. Cut 5 – 2" strips for binding.
Sew together into one continuous strip.
Press seam allowances open.
Fold binding in half (meeting long edges) with wrong side in. Press.
9. Sew binding to quilt.
Hand stitch binding to back of quilt.

10. Cut a 3" x 4 1/2" rectangle from muslin or white fabric (plain is best). Press under 1/2" on all edges. Stitch to the back of the cuddle quilt. That's it. You don't have to write anything on it. When Anita gets your finished cuddle quilt, she'll stamp on your muslin label. She has a stamp that puts all of the LQG information on the label.
