Ticket Taker do? Well it's a standing or seated position. Ticket Takers are quilt show greeters and they check to make sure that guests attending the show are wearing their wristband they received when paying their admission to see the show. Each day there will be a different color of wristband.

A "White Glover" is a person that wears white gloves, walks around the showroom floor, answers guest questions and offers to show them the back of a quilt if they're interested in seeing it. Remember, guests are not supposed to touch the quilts. White gloves will be provided for White Glovers or they are welcome to bring their own if they prefer. You'll also secretly keep a watchful eye for items that are not supposed to walk away!
