Dear Guild,

I'm sure you've been seeing all kinds of information about mask shortages and the need for hospital supplies. We've checked with Bryan after being notified that they were taking donations of homemade masks. We wanted to get the hospital's directions as we did not want to encourage you to work on something they wouldn't be able to accept.

Today Bryan let us know that they are accepting homemade masks, shoe covers, and surgical caps. They sent patterns which are available on our website at lincolnquiltersguild.org.

They also said that you can use your own favorite pattern with these additional requirements:

- Use new cotton fabric only—no fleece or flannel.
- Fabric needs to be laundered before and after the item is constructed.
- Finished items can be placed in a clean garbage bag and dropped off with the requested information at Bryan East Plaza Entrance desk (1500 S 48th).

Include a note with your:
