# Report on Lincoln Quiltfest 2006 Bloomin' Quilts

Thanks you to all who attended Quiltfest (an estimated 1,750)! We had some 1,200 "paying" guests, plus children, vendors, 150 workers and 250 members and guests at the Thursday night opening reception. Our very special guests included a group of 14 Japanese quilting instructors and several IQSC Board members in Lincoln for their meetings. Quilting curator, lecturer and author Jonathon Holstein (New York), Olga and Simon Prins co-founders of the European Art Quilt Foundation (Netherlands) and Donna Wilder of Freespirit Fabrics and PBS producer/host (Connecticut) were in attendance! Dr. Patricia Crews updated us on the IQSC progress and Gloria Smith shared information about the traveling Hoffman Challenge Quilts.

Our Bloomin' Beauty Raffle Quilt was won by Lincoln Quilters Guild member, Leola Kahl, who was present for the drawing!!! We're so pleased to have the quilt stay with our membership. A total of 4,471 tickets were sold. Net raffle profit was \$4016.81. Our members sold 2,541 tickets and 1,930 were sold at Quiltfest, other events such as Quilt Nebraska and local shops.

We had 256 "show" quilts. Members registered 120 as "contemporary," 108 as "traditional" and the remainder "other" (clothing, doll, liturgical, etc.).

1<sup>st</sup> Place – Sandy Anderson's "Smokey Mountain Cats" (quilted by Mary Dittenber) 2<sup>nd</sup> Place – Bonnie Kucera's "Wildflowers" 3<sup>rd</sup> Place – Caren Wagner's "Garden Bouquet"

#### We had 53 Lincoln Quilt Guild

Challenge "Artful Dwelling" quilts. Included in this display were fourteen 3-D houses (made by Quiltfest Committee). Viewer's Choice Ribbons were awarded for Artful Dwelling Challenge quilts: 1<sup>st</sup> Place – Patricia Shelley 2<sup>nd</sup> Place – Anita Dover

A lively audience attended the live Auction on Sunday afternoon. 106 quilts and other items brought in \$5025.00! The quilt and dishes donated yielded \$243.00 for the International Quilt Study Center. Habitat for Humanity received 10%, \$529.50! Thanks to you for your auction donations and to Linda Underwood for calling our live auction.

Our total Quiltfest net profit is \$10,140.14. We are proud of our donations benefiting Habitat for Humanity and the International Quilt Study Center!

Lincoln Quiltfest has received countless compliments. The Artful Dwelling display of quilts and 3-D houses generated much interest. International visitors and others have commented on the fine quality of all quilts exhibited. The committee has met to evaluate and make recommendations for future shows. Detailed reports are available for the next Quiltfest Chairs. The show ran very smoothly, thanks to all LQG members (and a few good men and teens) for your hard work! We are pleased to have been your co-chairs for Quiltfest. If you have specific questions, don't hesitate to call us.
