

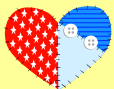

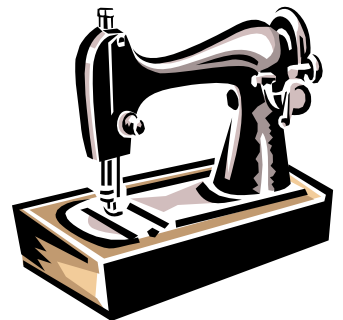

presenting her lecture on toy sewing machines. She has
been collecting toy machines for over thirty years and will
bring many examples from her collection, sharing details
about their history. She will also show quilts inspired by or
made using toy machines. Shelly is an award winning quilter, teacher and author who
will inform and entertain us.

The January class will be held on Tuesday, January 9th at Sheridan Lutheran Church at

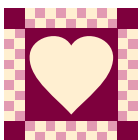

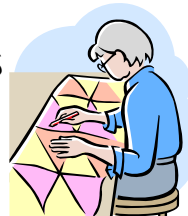

Minutes of the Lincoln Quilters Guild – November 14, 2006

College View Seventh-Day Adventist Church – Lincoln, Nebraska

Kate Laucomer called meeting to order. She announced we're going to do things a little differently tonight. Judy Lane will explain.

*"Tonight our guild is going to honor a very special member. As we begin, it is important for us to be properly ready for this event. So . . . **THE TIME IS NOW!** (at this moment, most of the present members put on funny/silly hats). Some of you are wondering - what is the deal with these hats? A simple answer: Funny hats to start a meeting or make a special announcement are a "trademark" of our honoree.*

A common method of conferring honors is to tell of the person's accomplishments and then reveal their identity. Tonight is different. You are going to know both the identity and the honor at the beginning and then hear about this person's contributions to the Guild. Tonight, the Lincoln Quilters Guild is presenting a LIFE MEMBERSHIP to CONNIE STROPE.

Connie has been a member of the guild since the mid 1980's. She quickly became an involved member and served as co-chair of the 2nd Annual Lincoln/Omaha Fall Retreat. A member shared that several years ago, at a Fall Retreat, Connie spent a lot of time teaching her a quilting technique. This encouragement and helpfulness to other quilters has been a continuing aspect of Connie's service to the Guild.

Connie has been a helpful participant with Guild quilt shows since the early days of her membership. Following the 1992 quilt show, Connie became part of a small quilt group formed by the show's planning committee. This group is called the Basket Cases. By 1994, she was the Chairperson of the Guild's quilt show, The Patchwork Garden. This was the first show held at the Cotner Center. The show's planners formed a small quilt group following that show. The Faded Blossoms group has met and taken trips together ever since that time. In addition to these small groups, Connie and three special quilting friends – Pat King, Kathi Kinnaman, and Sandy Anderson – have traveled to quilt conferences, quilt shows, and quilt shops for years and years!

In 1997-98, Connie served the Guild as President. Every meeting was opened with a joke – the very funny kind of joke that made us laugh and laugh and then feel better all through the evening. Great hats were another part of Connie's signature good humor throughout her presidency and beyond. Do you remember the gorgeous red hat with flowers and feathers that she

wore last spring when she was recruiting quilt show security helpers?

Connie served as District Representative to the board of the Nebraska State Quilt Guild. Along with Sandy Anderson and Kathi Kinnaman, Connie chaired QuiltNebraska when it was in Lincoln in 1999. This was a tremendous responsibility as the planning efforts had to be coordinated across the state, involving members of guilds throughout Nebraska as well as members of the Lincoln Quilters Guild. In 2000, Connie received a Radiant Star award from the State Guild for her part in chairing QuiltNebraska.

Connie has served as security chair for the Guild quilt shows held at Lux Middle School. As quilt cop, she recruited people to stay all night at the school in order to keep everything secure. Connie and her husband, Arnie, joined right in with the security crews in staying overnight during the shows. Imagine the laughter during those overnight hours with Connie on the job!

In 2004, Connie and Sandy Anderson created a very special exhibit at the Nebraska State Quilt Guild's annual QuiltNebraska in Lincoln. Their life-sized doll exhibit changed daily and delighted everyone at QuiltNebraska.

During this past year, Connie and Sandy created a wall quilt for the fire station that is just north of the International Quilt Study Center. Being involved in a project that helps people to connect and become friendly neighbors is typical of Connie's interest in reaching out to others through quilting.

These are some of the obvious quilting accomplishments of Connie Strope. As information came forth for this Life Membership Award, we learned about many "behind-the-scenes" actions: Connie's encouragement of others, her welcoming approach to quilting newcomers, her assistance with special-occasion quilts for friends, her help with all guild raffle quilts, and how she always made the effort to help other people feel comfortable.

Grace and humor are always woven throughout Connie's contributions to quilting. Her smiles, the very funny jokes and stories, and the ability to see the humorous aspect in situations have helped to smooth the way to decisions and actions. One person commented that Connie can run business meetings in a way that makes people enjoy sitting through them! That is a real accomplishment! One of the many life lessons we have learned from Connie is

that laughter is truly a healing art!

It is easy to recognize that a Life Membership for Connie Strope is richly deserved. It is also long overdue. We should have given this award to Connie years ago. We are pleased and excited to be doing it now!

Connie, please accept this Life Membership in the Lincoln Quilters Guild with our gratitude, our respect, our admiration, and our love."

- Fill out the form.
- Return the quilt and form in the unsealed Priority mail envelope to me (Kate) at a meeting. Unsealed so we can reuse the envelopes. I will be responsible for registering the quilts online and mailing them to Ami.

One thing you need to keep in mind. If you use a pattern, a pattern from a magazine, any type of pattern that is copyrighted, you need written permission from the designer to turn the quilt in. Make sure you have this and turn it in with your quilt in the envelope.

LQG Fabric Exchange Table

1. No money is involved (beyond your initial cost for fabric).
2. The table will consist of an assortment of fabrics in these sizes:
 - a. 9" squares
 - b. ¼ yards – straight cuts or fat quarters
 - c. ½ yards
3. You trade one-for-one.
 - a. one 9" square for one 9" square, one ¼ yard for a ¼ yard, one ½ yard for a ½ yard.
 - b. You cannot trade a ½ yard for two ¼ yard pieces or vice versa.
 - c. The trade must be "like for like".
4. If you contribute a "unit", but don't find one you want that month, you will be given a coupon to redeem at a later meeting. Coupons do not expire; neither will they be replaced if lost.





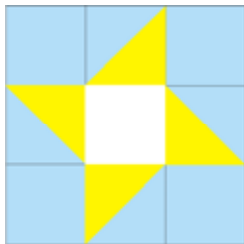
LQG QUILT CHALLENGE 2006-2007

Crazy 9-Patch Friendship Block

Martha Lane and Donna Welte have been brain-storming to come up with a new "twist" in the monthly *Friendship Blocks*. This idea is simple and won't require a pattern. Just follow these instructions



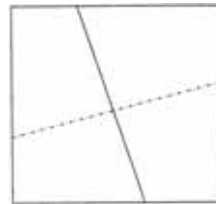
Cut 3 - 9" Squares: any color. Variety works the best. Layer all 3 squares, right sides up. Cut at a slant at least one and a half inches from the right edge. Lift the top right piece and move to the bottom of the stack. Sew what you see on the diagonal line. Press to the skinny side.



Re-layer the 3 sewn blocks, right sides up and cut another slant thru all 3 blocks being sure to leave at least one and a half inches from the left edge. Lift the top left piece and move to the bottom of the stack and sew on the diagonal. Be sure in this step the same fabric does not appear in the same block. Press to the skinny side.



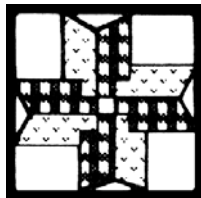
The blocks should be approximately 9" x 8". **Turn these in at the January 2007 meeting.**



Winners of the November friendship blocks

Stack at least 2, or up to 6 blocks and cut again thru the middle portion from left to right.

Move the top one half to the bottom of your stack and re-sew what you see. Trim to 5½".

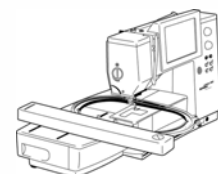


