



Santa Socks 2007



The 14th Santa Socks and Sacks community outreach project was an outstanding success. Statistics provided by Co-chairs, Gloria Smith and Sandy Gruntorad, were both informative and amazing.

A total of 289 socks/sacks were contributed by guild members and \$313.05 in cash was contributed at the November guild meeting through voting for favorite socks, proceeds from the Mini-affle, and general donations.

The socks/sacks and/or items for filling them were shared in the following ways:

- Cedars Home – 35 teenagers
- Fresh Start – 21 women
- St. Monica's – 45 women, 25 children 10 years and under, 15 babies
- Friendship Home – 50 women, 50 children
- Indian Center – 75 adults, 50 children

In addition, assorted items including soap, shampoo, crayons, and coloring books were donated to the People's City Mission.

The cash contributions at the November meeting plus money that was given throughout this past year specifically for Santa Socks/Sacks meant that there was still money to share after all of the above donations. Voices of Hope received a cash donation of just over \$200.00 from this guild outreach project!

The generosity of guild members will be remembered and treasured by many people in this community. The leadership of Gloria and Sandy for the past two years has been instrumental in expanding the giving of holiday socks/sacks. When we see Gloria or Sandy, let's be sure to thank them for their time, talent, and energy in carrying out their responsibilities in such a superb manner!!! Thank you and well done!

LQG Fabric Exchange Table

1. No money is involved (beyond your initial cost for fabric).
2. The table will consist of an assortment of fabrics in these sizes:
 - a. 9" squares
 - b. ¼ yards – straight cuts or fat quarters
 - c. ½ yards
3. You trade one-for-one.
 - a. one 9" square for one 9" square, one ¼ yard for a ¼ yard, one ½ yard for a ½ yard.
 - b. You cannot trade a ½ yard for two ¼ yard pieces or vice versa.
 - c. The trade must be "like for like".
4. If you contribute a "unit", but don't find one you want that month, you will be given a coupon to redeem at a later meeting. Coupons do not expire; neither will they be replaced if lost.

LQG NICKEL SWAP

We're still doing the Nickel Swap and you can still participate! All you have to do is follow the instructions below.

- ONE YARD 100% pre-washed cotton fabric – (28 pairs).
- Yes, you can use yardage from your stash – but be kind!
- We need Darks and Lights as well as Mediums
- Trim selvages off
- Cut 5 inch squares
- Stack fabric squares in twos – alter each pair at a 45 degree angle so it's easy to grab just two at a time.
- Place all trades in large "zip-lock type" bag labeled with your name.
- BRING TO MEETING – Pick up your swap (27 pairs) at the following meeting!

2008 Quilt Show Polo Shirts

The Compass Committee for the 2008 Quilt Show has decided to offer a "signature polo shirt" for members and/or workers and families to wear during LQG's May 2008 event. The decision to promote a common theme of one style and one color would work best in showcasing our members for the public attending the show, and would also be an added bonus of extra Security.

A POLO SHIRT of Jade Green color, with the quilt show **logo** created with thread embroidery will be offered through pre-paid orders in January, February and March, with delivery at our meetings in April and May. You may order as many shirts as you would like.

The polo shirts offered are a pique knit blend of 60% cotton/40% polyester with a non-roll collar and a squared hemmed bottom.

The shirts are available in **both short sleeve and long sleeve styles**, and sizes from youths, ladies, and mens, to 6XL and 6XLT.


