Patty makes her own fabrics and says, "Making my own fabrics is truly like chocolate cake, without all the calories, just delicious beyond words! It is glorious fun to dye fabrics! These unique fabrics inspire my fabric collages, which are fragments from our Colorado landscapes and living in our mountain town of Estes Park. My ideas come from the lights and shadows of the day, the seasons of the aspen trees, the amazing rock colors, reflection scribbles, and, of course, the amazing majesty of the Rocky Mountains."

New and renewed docents are welcomed by Angela Konin, Education Coordinator, IQSC&M. A formal new docent class will be offered in the fall, but a fast track docent training program is available now. 

# Raw Edge Applique Sunflowers

Part I

Due April and May LQG meetings.

Drawing for blocks at the

May 2009 meeting.

Fabric required for each flower: Large flower: 8½-inch square Small flower: 5½-inch square Middle flower: 7-inch square Center: 4-inch square



NOTE: There is no background fabric used for this flower.

Use different values of the yellow-gold family for flowers. Batiks, marble, tone on tone, as well as plaids, stripes and patterns. Just so there is contrast.

Center is dark brown. Plain or patterned is fine.

Fold the squares of fabric right sides together both horizontally and vertically. Press. A spritz of spray starch may help to stabilize.

Using the pattern below cut the flowers and center. *Mark the top of each.* 

Beginning with the middle flower and matching center folds stitch to the large flower with very small zig-zag stitch  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch from the edge.

Turn to wrong side and cut away the large flower fabric leaving about 1/4" from the stitching.


Turn to right side and attach the small flower to the middle flower. Again turn to the backside and trim.

Follow the same directions with the brown center and again turn to the back and trim the small flower fabric away.

You will turn this raw edge sunflower in for the drawing in May.



A Quilter's Favorite Recipe

Thought I would make some chocolate cupcakes for dinner one night.

I read over the recipe to get it just right. The first thing I read was "sift and measure the flour."



Well, I measured some fabric and I still had an hour. I went back to the recipe. It said, "<u>Cut</u> butter in." But I cut out some patterns and stuck in a pin.
