Now having completed its second year, The

Bryan Community quilting project in collaboration among the Lincoln Quilters Guild and Lincoln Public Schools' The Brvan Community. Chervl Wilkins, teacher of Family and Consumer Science, teaches the parenting class. Elizabeth Sterns of the Lincoln Quilters Guild developed the idea for the quilt project and chairs the project.

Volunteers from the Lincoln Quilters Guild began in the Fall of 2008 working in the classroom weekly with the eighteen Bryan students in the parenting class, teaching about fabric, color, design, and guiding students through the techniques of quilt making - cutting, piecing, batting, backing, and tying the guilts. Fabric either was donated by Guild members or purchased with funds provided by a grant from the Woods Charitable Fund. The Woods grant also made possible the purchase of cutters, rulers, mats, pins, thread, needles, scissors, and rippers. Ten sewing machines were gathered from the Lincoln Public Schools Family and Consumer Science resources to combine with those already at The Bryan Community.

In addition to making their own guilt, each student also made a block for cuddle quilts to be given as part of the Lincoln Quilters Guild cuddle quilt outreach project. Guild members sewed the blocks together, quilted and bound these gift quilts.



LQG Pillowcase Project

One of the Guild's newest projects is creating pillowcases. They will be distributed to the City Mission, then possibly hospitals or other social

service agencies. Perhaps you have fabric left from a quilt project, don't have time to make a quilt but could stitch up a pillowcase. Consider a service project in your small groups, or perhaps challenge each other to make the prettiest, most unusual, the most completed! Completed pillowcases will be collected in March 2010 to help us to celebrate the Lincoln Quilters Guild's Birthday!

Here are some instructions on how to make them.

FABRICS FOR ONE PILLOWCASE:

42 inches wide, 3/4 yards for body (main part)

1/3 yard for heading

1¾ inch for lip (piping)

Use 1/2 inch seams throughout.

THE LIP: (piping) Using the 1¾ inch strip of fabric with right sides together stitch along the short edge forming a tube. Fold tube in half WRONG sides together and press. (Tube is now 7/8 by 41 in.)

THE HEADING: Using the 1/3 yard of fabric with right sides together sew along the short side again forming a tube. Again fold the tube in half with WRONG sides together and press. (Tube is now 6 by 41 inches)

THE BODY: With the ¾ yard of fabric fold RIGHT sides together and stitch along one short end and the long side. (The folded piece should measure approximately 27 inches long by 21 inches wide) Use any preferred method to finish seams. Turn inside out and press.

TO ASSEMBLE: Place narrow lip (piping) around the open edge of pillow case body right sides together. Secure with a few pins. Next place the larger tube (heading) over the lip with all raw edges even. Pin layers together and sew. Finish raw edges as desired. Turn right side out and press.

Due October and November 2009 Drawing for blocks in November 2009


Please use assorted **batik** prints of reds, greens and cream fabric.

Sew the 9-patch block using the above diagram. Please make sure **red** is used in each of the four corners.

Pressing information:

1st row – press toward the red

2nd row – press toward the cream

3rd row – press toward the red

Make lots of 9-patch blocks. The blocks should measure 12½" square. Your name will be entered for each block you turn in.
