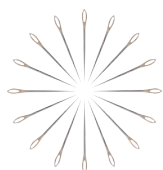

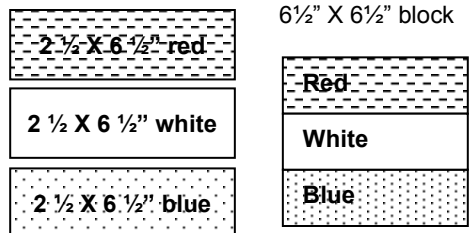
Friendship Block Exchange

Rail Fence Block

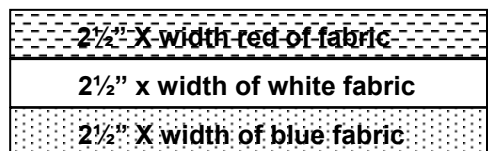
Due October/November
Drawing for blocks will be held at November meeting

We will be making a Rail Fence block from red, white/cream and blue fabrics.

To make a rail fence block cut a 2½" X 6½" rectangle from a red, a white and a blue fabric and join. This will make a 6½" X 6½" block.



Or strip piece:



After joining your strips, cut them every 6½" inches to make 6½" X 6½" blocks.

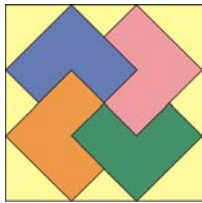

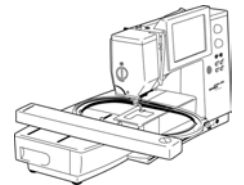
