The colors may change, the light/dark values may change, but a quilt made with one simple square will always stand as a testimony to the true essence of quilting. Fibers and Flowers . . . The Perfect Combination

A quilt show and a floral display combined....it doesn't get much better than this!

For the mum show currently in progress at the Lauritzen Gardens in Omaha, they are trying something new. For the past 9 months, they have been training mums that were planted in 5-foot diameter baskets to grow and trail downward along impressive 6-foot long metal arms. These baskets will hang 15 feet in the air from the ceiling of the great floral hall, and the rest of the mum show was designed to highlight these stunning baskets. There are only a few locations across the country where you can see such unique creations.

To make this years mum show even more exciting, a quilt show is being incorporated into the garden mum show. Quilts from Eastern Neb. and Western Iowa will be in the show, all with a botanical theme. Many of the quilts will be for sale. Vendor booths offering fabrics, hand made papers, needlepoint supplies, hand made quilted purses and dog collars as well as many other items will be for sale. And as an added treat, a special collection of quilts from the International Quilt Study Center in Lincoln will also be on display.

The quilt show will run Nov. 12-14, 2010. Admission is \$6.00, which includes the indoor mum show, the quilt show, and access to the entire Lauritzen gardens. Hours of the show are 9am-5pm daily. The garden is located at 100 Bancroft St. in Omaha. Food is available over the lunch hour in the small café.






Lincoln Quilters Guild Supports Deployed Troops

Due the generosity of the Lincoln Quilter's Guild, 85 deployed Nebraska Army National Guard service personnel will enjoy a "bit of Nebraska" this Christmas. At the recent October meeting of the Guild, *Anita Dover, Pillowcase Chairperson,* along with LQG member, *Carol Rystrom*, presented 85 pillowcases to SSGT Matthew Rouse, Headquarters and Headquarters' Troop, 1-134th R&S or Cavalry based at Penterman Armory in Lincoln. The troops were deployed July 29, of this year and after several months training, they will be leaving for Afghanistan; to be gone for about one year.

Along with SSGT Rouse, accepting the pillowcases were Maurice Saunders and her co-leader, Laura Whitaker, leaders of the Family Readiness Group for this Unit. This group coordinate activities with outside organizations to gather items for Soldiers, which families then send overseas prior to Christmas. Pocket Hand Warmers

by Kathryn Goodman

These rice-filled hand warmers are made from cozy flannel with an extra "pocket" on the outside

for added warmth for your fingers. Heat them in the microwave for just 20 seconds and they're

ready to pop in your coat pockets, keeping your hands toasty warm in cold winter weather.

- ¼ yard each of two coordinating flannel fabrics
- 1 spool coordinating thread
- 1 cup uncooked rice
- Scissors or rotary cutter
- Straight-edged ruler
- Straight pins
- Turning tool or a wooden chopstick

1. Cutting the Fabric

Note: Wash, dry and iron fabrics before cutting. Use a ½" seam allowance throughout unless otherwise stated. Seam allowance is included in pattern pieces. From the main flannel fabric, cut four 5½" x 5½" squares. From the coordinating flannel fabric, cut two 5½" x 8" rectangles.

2. Constructing the Hand Warmers

To form the outside pocket, fold the 5" x 8" piece of coordinating flannel in half width-wise. Press.

- 3. Place the pocket piece on one of the main flannel fabric pieces, right sides facing up.
- 4. Place a second piece of the main flannel fabric piece on top, right side facing down.
- 5. Pin the three layers of fabric around all four sides.
- Stitch around the sides, leaving an opening at the top about 2" wide.
- 7. Clip the corners.
- **8.** Turn the hand warmer right side out, gently pushing the corners out using a turning tool or chopstick.
- 9. Press.
- **10.** Using the opening at the top, fill the hand warmer with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of rice.
- **11.** Pin the opening closed. Make sure all of the rice is settled toward the bottom of the hand warmer.
- **12.** Use a blindstitch or edgestitch foot to close.

Close up of edgestitch across top.

Repeat all steps with the remaining fabric to make the second hand warmer.

Heating the Hand Warmers

IMPORTANT: Never leave warmers unattended in microwave oven. Do not heat longer than recommended time.

Place the two warmers in a microwave oven and heat on high for 20 seconds. Shake the hand warmers to distribute the warmed rice.

Rail Fence Block

We will be making a Rail Fence block from red, white/cream and blue fabrics.

To make a rail fence block cut a 2½" X 6½" rectangle from a red, a white and a blue fabric and join. This will make a 6½" X 6½" block.

61/2" X 61/2" block

2 ½ X 6 ½" red	Red
2 ½ X 6 ½" white	White
2 ½ X 6 ½" blue	Blue

Or strip piece:

2½"X width red of	fabric	
2½" x width of whi	ite fabric	
2½" X width of blu	e fabric	1

After joining your strips, cut them every $6\frac{1}{2}$ " inches to make $6\frac{1}{2}$ " X $6\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks.
