


Monday, January 10, 2011 Speaker: Bonnie Hunter Adventures with Leaders and Enders



Santa Socks 2010 Report

During 2010 the Santa Sock program collected items all year at the Guild meetings. Listed here are some of the items we collected.

- 252 Christmas stockings
- 310 stocking hats
- 145 mittens/gloves
- 68 new crayon boxes
- 180 pencils
- 98 notebooks
- 326 toothbrushes

We also received many tubes of toothpaste, lots of shampoo and conditioner, lots of toys, and many other items. We received \$374 from voting on favorite Christmas stocking and from the small item raffle at the November meeting. Using the cash received, we purchased hundreds of pairs of sock for women, men, children and infants.

This year our committee decided to support two agencies in Lincoln because we felt it was important to donate enough items to each agency to make a very helpful donation to these two agencies. We chose to give half of the items to *Clyde Malone Center* and half to *Matt Talbot Kitchen and Outreach Center*. Clyde Malone Center supports many programs for children, after school programs, elder day care facility, and they help families in need of food. The Matt Talbot Kitchen moved into new facilities in April of 2010. They are able to provide even more assistance for the working-poor of Lincoln. Not only do they prepare three meals every day of the week, they now provide shower facilities and laundry facilities to people in need.

Scholarship Available

The Lincoln Quilters Guild (LQG) offers a scholarship for a quilt-related research project not to exceed a total of \$1,000 to an individual who meets the following qualifications:

- 1. A person/persons engaged in graduate studies in the area of textile history or textile conservation at the University of Nebraska, or
- 2. A person/persons engaged in the study of quilting outside the academic community.

Interested applicants should submit no later than March 1 of each year:

- 1. A completed application form (available as noted above), and
- Letters of recommendation from three (3) persons acquainted with the scholastic or professional work of the applicant

The following restrictions apply:

The award may not be used to purchase equipment which will remain with the scholar when the project is finished.

The applicant cannot knowingly derive financial or commercial gain from this award.

The successful applicant will be expected to report to Lincoln Quilters Guild within a year following the award.

Successful applicants will be notified and announcement of the award(s) will be made in April of each year at that month's LQG meeting.

Friendship Block Exchange/January 2011 Split or Modified Nine Patch

We will be making a Split Nine Patch block from a variety of light and dark fabrics to give it a scrappy look. The entire 6½" block consists of 2 half square triangles, 4 dark squares and 3 light squares.

To make the half square triangles cut out a 2 7/8" light and 2 7/8" dark square. Place right sides together and draw a diagonal line on the light fabric.




Stitch a slim ¼" wide seam on both sides of the diagonal line. Cut along the diagonal line and press open to make 2 half-square triangle units.





Arrange two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " half square triangle units, four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " dark squares and three $2\frac{1}{2}$ " light squares as shown below.

Sew 3 horizontal rows together and join rows to complete block. This will make a $6\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ block.
