# Board Proposes to change LQG Year

#### Why change our Guild year?

- W.I.N.T.E.R. and I.C.E. are two good reasons!!! Flying speakers in during November, January, and February (and sometimes March) is always risky business. Keep in mind "normal" winters in Nebraska!
- What do we do if we already have the speaker here and a storm comes through as happened in January

#### What would the NEW Guild year be?

The Guild year would run from December 1st through November 30th. The Board would still have three months after installation until they started with Guild meetings.

- Officers: The 3 "elect" officers (for President, Vice-President, and Treasurer) have agreed to serve the additional 6 months to get the Guild through the transition.
- To supplement the budget for the extended time period, the Board has recommended withdrawing extra funds from our reserve CDs. Membership dues will not increase during the transition and members will actually receive 3 extra meetings **free** during the transition!
- The Board is considering different "Alternate Activities" for June of the new Guild year - starting in June 2013. (The church is not available in June.) Quilters can have fun...it is not against any bylaw!
- July and August ... yes the church is air conditioned!
- Daylight savings time from March through November means it will be lighter outside when we're driving J
- Since the transition year would not be a Quilt Show year, these changes make sense from a planning perspective.
- At this point in time, we do not anticipate this change would affect

# LQG's 39th Birthday Party and more!



Mark your calendars for 1st Friday, March 2, 4:30-7:00pm at the International Quilt Study Center & Museum. Ellen Rushman will speak about Modern Quilting: DIY (Do It Yourself) Discourse, 5:30-6:30 pm. Ellen, recipient of the Lincoln Quilters Guild scholarship and graduate student in the University of Nebraska Quilt Studies program, interviewed 26 members of several MQG's across the United States last fall and is currently completing her thesis work exploring what draws quilters into the MQG as well as how they contextualize the work they are creating in terms of art and craft.

In October 2009, The Modern Quilt Guild (MQG) hosted its first meeting in Los Angeles, California. The group had grown out of an active online community where guilters shared their work through blogs, flickr, and other social networks. The first MQG shared their idea online and new MQG's started forming around the United States and across the globe. To date there are over 100 MQG's. Each MQG has a presence online as well as hosting in person meetings where members participate in design challenges, do community service projects, and share their projects with each other. "Modern" is interpreted differently by individual members. however it is both an attitude as well as an aesthetic. The "modern" attitude towards guiltmaking embraces the free spirit of the maker, while the aesthetic embodies elements of minimalism and simplicity.

The Lincoln Quilters Guild was organized March 13, 1973 at the home of Mary Ghormley with about 25 ladies attending the first meeting. The purpose was to "promote quilting and to learn more about it through study and sharing." 39 years later, the tradition continues!



# Winter 2012 · Friendship Block

#### Slanted Stars Block

Brights or batiks with solid black corners (points)



Cut two 3½ inch squares of solid black fabric

Fold each black square in half diagonally and press, or draw a line diagonally from corner to corner with chalk

With Batik/Bright side up, stitch diagonally across each black square, as shown, following the creased line or the chalk line.

Press black squares, as shown, towards corners to form the star points.

DO NOT TRIM THE FOLDED CORNERS!!

(The winner of the block will perhaps want to stitch ½ inch away and cut between stitching lines to form a 2½ inch half-square triangle.)

Please consider donating a block, or two, to the Friendship Block project. Gloria and Pam would like to assemble a quilt from the donated squares that can be auctioned at the LQG Quilt Show!

Your name will be entered into the drawing for each block you turn in — including those that are donated! You may wish to use address labels adhered to a slip of paper for the drawing.

These blocks will be collected at the January and February meetings. The winners of the blocks will be drawn at the February meeting.

#### **BYLAWS**

 If the Guild votes to change our fiscal year and meeting months to the new plan, several small Bylaw wording changes will need to be made. These can be handled by presenting the changes in March, putting them in the April Plain Print, and voting on them at the April meeting.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS QUESTIONS**

- Why change the fiscal year? We need to change our fiscal year so it reflects our Guild year and the terms of office for the Board. We would have a short fiscal year (6/1/12 11/30/12) to help us transition to the new fiscal year (December 1 November 30)

Take Something Old and Let It's Sparkle Out??? Take Something Old and Make Something New???


- 1. Mixed Media Use what you have around the house!

3. There must be hand or machine quilting holding the three layers together.




- 4. It may **NOT** be a regular rectangle (where sides A and C are one length and sides B and D are another length).
