1/6/12-7/29/12: Tribute to Ardis James Ardis

James loved quilts and all things about quiltmaking. Her legacy will live on in many ways, including one of her primary passions, the International Quilt Study Center & Museum. Since the original donation of the Ardis and Robert James Collection in 1997 and the establishment of the International Quilt Study Center, Ardis remained actively informed of and involved in the workings of the center until her passing in July 2011. This exhibition will feature quilts donated in her honor by many of today's leading studio quilt artists.

3/2/12-9/2/12: Jean Ray Laury: Getting It All Together The display of many of the over 40 quilts recently donated by Laury's family to the IQSC&M celebrates the artist's full and productive life and her more than half a century of creative output in quilts, wood, paper, and other materials.

The quilts tell only part of the story. A display of some of Laury's personal records—class samples, sketchbooks, manuscripts, diaries, and photos from the University Library Archives—complete the picture of a woman who had "it all together."

Frequent Asked Questions:

<u>Size</u>: Lap size to twin bed size (meaning minimum width of the quilt should be 55" and maximum width is 72"; minimum length is 65" and maximum length is 90").

<u>Fabric:</u> 100% cotton, best quality you can afford.

<u>Color</u>: Red, white and blue QOVs are the most popular but other "guy" colors are good, too. Please avoid feminine or juvenile prints

Pattern: your choice

Quilting: machine quilted, not tied (you are invited to bring your finished tops and backings to the Guild meetings and we will find a long-armer to quilt for you)

<u>Label:</u> quilter/s' name/s, location, date, QOV and leave a space for the recipient's name (labels can be downloaded from <u>www.QOVF.org</u>)

<u>Pillowcase:</u> coordinating with your QOV to be used as a presentation case for the QOV.

Registration Information

All members of Lincoln Quilters Guild are encouraged to consider exhibiting some of their work in the 2012 quilt show. The following guidelines will help members plan their entries and help Quilt Show volunteers with the proper display and return of items. Please read carefully before completing registration form(s)!

- Exhibitors must be members of Lincoln Quilter Guild unless exhibiting by invitation of the Quilt Show Committee.
- Items must not have previously been shown in an LQG quilt show unless by invitation of the Quilt Show Committee.
- · Show categories are:

General – This includes bed quilts (crib to king), wall hangings, throws, miniatures, table runner or toppers, art quilts, etc. The item must hang flat; no dolls, garments, handbags, etc. A limit of 4 entries in this category per member will be allowed. One series of up to 4 pieces will be allowed per member and will count as one item.

Challenge – "Take Something Old and Let It's Sparkle Out"

Quilts of Valor (QOV) Made according to

QOV guidelines, these quilts will be donated to the QOV project after the show and will not be returned to the maker.

Young Quilt Artists – Quilts made by LPS Bryan Focus School students

Intergenerational Quilting - Limit of two per child; quilt project done predominately by the child with help of LQG member.

- A **separate** registration form must be completed for **each entry**.
- All entries must be finished projects; hanging sleeves are not necessary for quilt show entry.
- All entries must be clean, smoke and odor free
- A label with the entrant's name and the name of the piece must be permanently attached to each quilt.
- The exhibitor is responsible for insurance on their entries.
- Items entered in the quilt show may be photographed as video and flash cameras are allowed at the quilt show.
- All quilts must remain on display for the duration of the show. Quilts will not be released until the entire show has been taken down.
- Registration will be done online. If you do not have online access, contact the registrar at 402-423-3863 or at the Quilt Show table during Guild meetings.
- Online registration deadline for Challenge items is April 9th. <u>Challenge items must</u> <u>be turned in at the April Guild meeting</u> (April 9th)
- All other items to be displayed in the 2012 quilt show should be delivered to the Weary Center on Tuesday, May 15, 2012 between 7:15 am and 7:00 pm.


Spring 2012 · Friendship Block

Pastel Rectangle Blocks


The blocks will be done in spring/pastel colored fabric.

All the centers are green.

1. Cut strips of spring/pastel green fabric into 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch strips. Sub-cut into a $2\frac{1}{2}$ x $6\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip for the center of each block.



2. Cut a 3 inch strip of a printed spring/pastel colored fabric (NOT GREEN). Sub-cut this strip into two 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch strips. Sew a strip to each side of the center green fabric, right sides together, using a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam. The block will now measure $6\frac{1}{2} \times 7\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Press the seams towards the green center. (Follow arrows.)



3. From the same 3 inch strip of spring/pastel fabric, sub-cut two 3 \times 7 ½ inch strips. With right sides together, sew the strips to the top and bottom of the block, using a ¼ inch seam. Press these seams away from the center. (Follow arrows.)

4. The block that is turned in will measure $7\frac{1}{2}$ x $11\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

(Winners of the blocks may wish to trim the blocks to $6\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inches, or to a uniform size. If the blocks are trimmed, remember to trim the same amount from the top and bottom, and the same amount from each side.)

*** Blocks will be turned in at the March and April Guild meetings. The drawing for the blocks will be at the April meeting. This finishes the Friendship Blocks for this Guild year.



Take Something Old and Let It's Sparkle Out??? Take Something Old and Make Something New???


- Mixed Media Use what you have around the house!
- 2. There must be 3 layers:

A Top – it must include fabric

A Backing – it must include fabric

A Middle – batting and/or Timtex/Peltex

3. There must be hand or machine quilting holding the three layers together.



- 4. It may **NOT** be a regular rectangle (where sides A and C are one length and sides B and D are another length).
- 5. Width: 30" or less Height: 30" or less

We're looking for different shaped quilts! These would all be good. So would circular!

This project will need to be turned in for the Quilt Show at the APRIL 2012 meeting.

Suggestions:

- Stamping
- Dye
- Recyclables
- Laces
- Paint
- Yarn
- Batting on top of Peltex for middle
- (Peltex gives stability and batting, makes it feel like a quilt)
- It doesn't need to be 4-sided
- Think more or less than 4 sides!
- Found objects
