

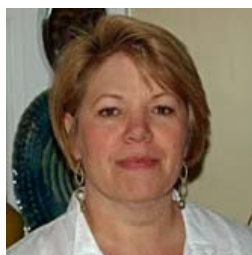

Speaker: Heather Thomas



Heather is the author of the book Color & Design: the basics and beyond. For more than a decade, she has taught 13 month long color classes as well as her one day class: Quick Color adventure. In her lecture, she will introduce listeners to the concepts of color and the elements and principles of design. She uses actual quilts and artwork as well as a Power Point presentation in her lecture. She will cover basic color and design terms, classic color combinations, the use of Fibonacci sequencing and the Golden Mean. She will show examples of good composition and will help viewers to understand the concepts of color scale and value.

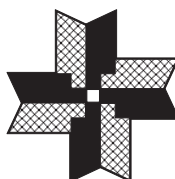

Installation of Officers:

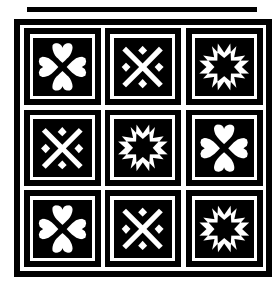

9pm Sandy adjourned the meeting to Show & Tell.

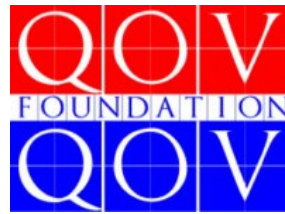

Thank you

We challenged Guild members to make 100 QOVs for the Quilt Show, and you met the challenge!!! We had 102 QOVs displayed at the show. Nearly all of the QOVs have been awarded now; we provided QOVs to the Nebraska National Guard; a Vietnam veterans' reunion event; and nearly two dozen individual requests. The bulk of the QOVs were sent to the military facility in Landstuhl, Germany to provide comfort to warriors wounded in Afghanistan.

The War is NOT over!

We are sad to report that the war is not over, and despite what you may be reading in the newspaper, the US military is suffering an increase in wounded warriors. We are now focusing our efforts in sending QOVs to Landstuhl, Germany, which is where most warriors wounded in Afghanistan are treated before being sent back to the US. It is the goal of the medical personnel at Landstuhl to cover every wounded American service member with a Quilt of Valor to provide him or her comfort on the long flight back to the US. Please help us in this effort by making Quilts of Valor.

Labeling Your Quilts of Valor

Quilts of Valor Foundation has changed its policy regarding labeling Quilts of Valor. Going forward, please include on the label only the following information:

- **First name, last initial (do not include your full name)**
- **City and State where you live. If you are uncomfortable including the city, it is ok to just include your state of residence**
- **Include no other personal information, such as email address, etc.**
- **If you include a journal or letter with your QOV, do not include any personal information beyond what is listed above.**

The Foundation has made this change at the request of certain organizations through which QOVs are distributed because these entities are concerned about protecting the quilter's privacy.

We realize many of your QOVs already have labels with full names and other personal information. That is ok, and we are taking care to distribute those QOVs.

It is not necessary to remove labels from quilts you have already completed but going forward, please follow the new label guidelines.

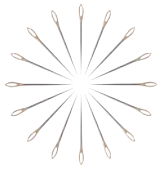

2012 Byron and Sara Rhodes Dillow Excellence Fund Public Lecture: "Mark My Words" by Julie Silber

Nearly from the start, some quilt makers have incorporated the written word into their work. Illustrating with slides and textile examples, Julie will discuss a fascinating range of motives, techniques, and messages in quilts made as early as 1800 -- and as recently as the day before yesterday.

Julie Silber is a respected quilt expert who has been selling antique quilts to museums, businesses, and individuals since 1968. Julie was the curator of the Esprit Quilt Collection in San Francisco and is the co-author of the critically acclaimed books, *Hearts and Hands* (Nelson, 2000) and *Amish: The Art of the Quilt* (Knopf, 1990).

This event is in conjunction with the exhibition ***What's in A Name? Inscribed Quilts***

2013 Symposium Quilts in Context: The Making of Meaning, April 26-27, 2013

This symposium will focus on the various contexts inhabited by quilts and how those contexts shape and alter quilts' meanings. The keynote speakers will address quilts, domestic interiors and dress in a variety of contexts.:

- domestic interiors, decorative, furnishings, and architectural contexts;
- relationships between quilts and fashion/style that situate them within shared material contexts;
- appearance in photos, print, advertising that show real or imagined contexts made possible by technology;
- and non-domestic, new, or emerging contexts within human-made places—such as museum, galleries, and fairs—in which quilts appear as art or alongside other art/craft/artifacts.

Invited speakers include Lynne Bassett, Linda Eaton, and Joan Severa, plus guest exhibition curator Janet Finley. Online reservation will be available October 1, 2012. Space will be limited.

Course fees are set at \$6 per hour, so a 3 hour workshop fee is \$18 for members; for non-members the fee is \$26 and includes a 10+% upcharge plus \$6 admission. A 6 hour workshop is \$36 for members and \$46 for non-members. The IQSCM pays instructors 50% of the membership fee rate for each participant.

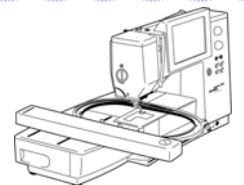
