
Happy Birthday America! Bicentennial and Centennial Quilts July 8, 2013

Interim Executive Director:

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln is pleased to announce the appointment of Alice Kinsler as the International Quilt Study Center & Museum's interim executive director beginning Aug. 5.

"It's an incredible honor to serve as the interim executive director of the International Quilt Study Center & Museum and to help with the search for a permanent full-time executive director," Kinsler said.

"We anticipate that the IQSCM's reputation for excellence, encouragement of scholarship, its remarkable collection and striking building will attract a high level of candidates." said Michael James, Textiles, Merchandising & Fashion Design Department (TMFD) chair, who will oversee the search process.

Founding Director Patricia Cox Crews ends her 16-year tenure on Aug. 3. She will assist Kinsler during a transition period, and plans to return to full-time teaching and research in TMFD, where she has been a faculty member since 1984. The growth of the IQSCM and its programs, collections and international reputation bring it to a new developmental stage that will benefit by the leadership and vision that a full-time executive Director will bring to the role.

"The IQSCM is an extraordinary museum and research center, and Crews has done a fine job preparing it for a new director to lead the museum in its next phase of development," said Marjorie Kostelnik, dean of the College of Education and Human Sciences.

Kinsler holds masters degrees in human relations from Golden Gate University in San Francisco and in textile history with a quilt studies emphasis from UNL. She served as the president and chief executive officer of Hospice Foundation in Monterey, Calif., from 1998 until her retirement in June 2013. Before joining Hospice Foundation, Kinsler served nine years as director of the Salinas Valley Memorial Hospital Foundation, four years as associate director of Community Foundation for Monterey County and prior to that development director of the Carmel Bach Festival.

"As we move forward in our executive search for the museum's next director, Alice's experience in administration, management, communications and development will be an immense asset. Her appointment will provide strong transitional leadership for the museum," James said



Feathered Star Sampler

Class: Monday and Tuesday, September 9th and 10th, 2013

Two day class fee: \$70

RED, WHITE, AND BLUE MOCK LOG CABIN FRIENDSHIP BLOCKS You will make two blocks—one that is red and white (cream) and one that is red and blue. All block centers are red. Donated blocks will be assembled into a Quilt of Valor! Cut two 3 ½ by 3 ½ inch squares of red. Cut two $3\frac{1}{2}$ by $3\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares of white (cream). Cut two 3 ½ by 3 ½ inch squares of blue. Cut two 3 ½ by 9 ½ inch strips of white (cream). Cut two 3 ½ by 9 ½ inch strips of blue. Assemble as follows: Press seams according to arrows. Place the two blocks together, right sides facing each other. Long seams of the two squares should be in opposite direc-Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the light square. Stitch 1/4 inch away on each side of the line. Cut apart on the marked line. Press seams open. You will have two blocks! **Do not trim!** Drawing for the blocks will be at the August LQG meeting. Enter one chance for each block turned in.
