Speaker: Monique Dillard

Monique Dillard of Rockford IL (USA), was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba (Canada). Her love of quilting was nurtured by relatives in Canada who taught her the art of handwork and sewing. She parlayed her degree in mathematics into a genuine understanding of the need for an accurate 1/4" seam, squared blocks and precise cutting. She was a regular teacher at her local quilt shop for 15 years until her budding quilt design business - Open Gate – steered her career toward a national audience. These days, you can find Monique teaching across the United States at quilt guilds and weekend retreats. Monique's classes always fill up fast with fans from previous classes and students eager to learn from this talented designer.

Monique has 76 (and counting) Open Gate patterns and 6 rulers (Fit to be Square[©], Fit to be Geese[©], Fit to be Quarter [©], Mini Fit to be Geese[©]). She has also partnered with Sue Glorch of Bundles and Bolts Quilt Co. to co-author 3 block-of-the-month (BOM) books. She finds inspiration for her traditional designs everywhere and is inspired by fabrics, textiles and tapestries. Several trips to Europe have resulted in not only new beautiful quilt pattern designs, but also her fabric line, Olde World Style with Maywood Studio. Olde World Style debuted in May, 2010 at the International Quilt Market in Minneapolis, MN.

In 2011, C&T Publishing debuted Monique's first solo book, *Fat Quarter Winners. Traditional Fat Quarter Quilts* was published in 2012, and *Diamond Traditions* was released in 2013. In addition to authoring books, Monique also a frequent contributing writer to various quilt magazines, such as *Quilts and More*, and *American Patchwork and Quilting*.



Minutes of the Lincoln Quilters Guild - March 10, 2014 College View Seventh-Day Adventist Church - Lincoln, Nebraska

President Linda Daiker called the meet- Announcements: Kathy Spitsen ing to order at 7:00 PM with a welcome. She reminded everyone to silence cell phones. Photos may not be taken during the PowerPoint portion of the presentation.

Speaker Jacquie Gering was introduced for her presentation of "Quilting Modern: Honoring Tradition." Vice Presidents Sara Kenny and Mary Sedlak discussed the upcoming programs, April 14 will be "Designing Fabric and Books" with Monique Dillard and the class will be "Mini Fit to be Geese." Sue Daley will present the May 12 program, "English Paper Piecing" with the class "Playing with Papers." They also discussed the Quilt R Done project challenging members to complete unfinished projects from previous quilt classes. If a project is completed and shown at a future Guild meeting, a Quilt R Done charm will be awarded. A "Mystery Quilt" instructions and first clue are available for a lap size guilt (or larger as the Guild has permission from the designer). The rest of the clues will be printed in *Plain Print*. The "Best Day Ever" described the joy of presenting 50 quilts to the middle school students at St. Mary's School in Lincoln. These students will sing for the Korean Veterans honor flight in Omaha. A poster board has photos and thank you notes from the students. President Daiker convened the business meeting. There being no additions or corrections, the Minutes of the November 2013 meeting were approved as printed in *Plain Print*, and the November 2013 Treasurer's report was remanded for audit.

Lincoln Quilt Fest: Mary Swinton reminded everyone that Quilt Fest will be July 10 – 12 at St. Marks Church at 84th and Pioneers from 9:00 AM - 8:00 PM and 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM on Saturday. Admission is \$6.00 for adults and \$1.00 for school age children. There will be a vendor mall, demonstrations and lectures, Tradition with a Twist challenge, modern quilts, quilts by men, intergenerational quilts and attic treasures. Raffle tickets for "My Heart is Home" quilt are available. \$1700 tickets have been sold and we can sell over 4000. Lorelee Novak said that guilt registration will be online and will begin in April with a firm deadline of July 1. Exhibitors can display up to 3 quilts or 4 if it is a series. The guidelines will be in Plain Print.

Phyllis Higley represented the Attic Treasures committee. This used to be a silent auction but now will be a tag sale. They are accepting quilt related items and will have a donation receipt for donors. There will be a table at each general meeting. They will be asking for volunteers to staff Attic Treasures at the Quilt Fest.

Vicky Skuodas discussed the quilt show CD. Donors will be asked to list the inspiration for their quilt on the entry form. It is estimated the CD will cost \$10.00 plus an additional \$2.00 for mailing.

President Daiker introduced Jan Sittler. the guilt department superintendent from the Nebraska State Fair. Sittler invited everyone to attend and exhibit quilts. Between 400 – 700 quilts are on display at the fair in an air-conditioned building.

The meeting was adjourned to Show and Tell.



National Quilting Day 2014, our fifth annual event, was held at the International Quilt Study Center and Museum on Saturday, March 15. The FREE admission event was planned and sponsored by the Lincoln Quilters Guild and the Nebraska State Quilt Guild. A huge thanks to our commercial sponsors AccuQuilt, Aurifil and Handi Quilter. All provided give away items to our guests! We had 737 visitors from Nebraska, 17 other states, India and Germany! Thanks to our great

volunteers and museum staff, the event ran very smoothly this year, a result of excellent offerings and diligent publicity. The ever popular lectures included Carolyn Ducey, IQSCM Curator, "The Whole Story," Paulette Peters, "Plop a Picture," Studio Art Quilt Associates, "Art Quilts" by Peg Pennell and Gloria Miller, "Log Cabin Quilts." The Studio Art Quilt Associates shared a display of 12" square art quilts and answered questions from our guests. Lincoln Quilters Guild outreach projects, Habitat for Humanity, Young Quilt Artist and Santa Socks were featured and shared examples of their offerings. Guests had their photo taken with our giant Photo Frame! The Quilt Alliance was on hand videotaping quilts and their stories, "Go Tell it at the Quilt Show." Our third floor was dedicated to Hand Work demonstrations and an exhibition of doll quilts and beds. Docents interacted with guests in the galleries to view the current quilt exhibitions. Our Community Showcase exhibition of Log Cabin Quilts will continue to April 19. The quilts are provided by members and friends of the National Quilting Day 2014 Steering Committee and feature a variety of styles of Log Cabins-traditional, art, improvisational and modern!

Quilt Delivery

All quilts entered in the Lincoln Quiltfest 2014 should be delivered to St. Mark's Church at 84th and Pioneers Blvd. on Tuesday, July 8 between the hours of 7:30 am and 7:00 pm. Go to south side of church building (on Pioneers Blvd.), east end. If you are not personally able to deliver your entries, please make arrangements for someone to do so during the drop-off time period.

If you are not going to be able to pick up your quilts at the end of the show, you can arrange for someone else to pick up your quilts. However, you must communicate those arrangements to the quilt drop-off personnel by giving them a signed permission note with the name of the person who will be picking up your quilts. All members of Lincoln Quilters Guild are encouraged to consider exhibiting quilts in the 2014 show. The following guidelines will help members plan their entries and help Quiltfest volunteers with the proper display and return of items.

Please read carefully before completing registration form(s)!

- Exhibitors must be members of Lincoln Quilters Guild unless exhibiting by invitation of the Quiltfest Steering Committee.
- Items must not have previously been shown in an LQG quilt show unless by invitation of the Quilt-fest Steering Committee.
- "Tradition With a Twist" Challenge quilts are not included with this registration process.

Show categories are:

General – Three items will be allowed per member.

This includes bed quilts (crib to king), wall hangings, throws, miniatures, table runners, art quilts, 3-D items (garment, purse, journal, etc.) or one Series of quilts (up to four items - counts as one entry).

Intergenerational Quilts - Limit of one per child; quilt project made mainly by the child with help of LQG member.

Young Artist – Quilts made by LPS Bryan Focus School students.

- A separate registration form must be completed for each entry.
- All entries must be finished projects; hanging sleeves are not necessary.
- All entries must be clean, smoke and odor free.
- A label with the entrant's name and the name of the piece must be permanently attached to each quilt.
- If insurance is desired, it will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to obtain it.
- Items entered in the quilt show may be photographed as video and flash cameras are allowed at the quilt show. Images may be used by LQG for their website, and Facebook
- All quilts must remain on display for the duration of the show. Quilts will not be released until the entire show has been taken down. Detailed instructions for pick-up will be given at quilt drop off.
- Registration will be done online. If you do not have online access, contact the registrar at 402-423-3863 or at the Quilt Show table during Guild meetings.
- All items to be displayed in the 2014 quilt show should be delivered to St. Mark's United Methodist Church, 84th & Pioneers on Tuesday, July 8, 7:30 am to 7:00 pm.


