rickrack handles. Another option is to use Dresden Plates in a border. Dresden Plates are great for using up scrap fabrics. Cutting is made easy with acrylic templates (or you can make a plastic template). Leave with a head start on a Dresden Plate project of your choice (you can even design your own if you wish). Watch out, these are addictive!

Habitat for Humanity





International Quilt Study Center & Museum

Be sure to check out the newest exhibition on display at the International Quilt Study Center & Museum. "Modern Marvels: Quilts Made from Kits, 1915-1950," opened on June 6. "We're excited to share some excellent examples of this very popular style with our visitors," said Marin Hanson, IQSCM Curator of Exhibitions. "Quilts made from kits are recognized as a hallmark of the early 20th century, an era when quiltmaking was at a zenith. Many people today still remember older relatives making quilts, a great number of which were likely made from commercially produced kits." In the 1920s and 1930s, quilt kits were new on the market and seen as a modern, time-saving way to make welldesigned bedcoverings. Kits included ready-made sets of

die-cut pieces for applique and pieced quilts.

"Modern Marvels: Quilts Made from Kits" features some of the designers, companies and publications that were wellknown for their kits during this time period. The exhibition will include pieces from Marie Webster, Anne Orr and other famed designers from the era.

IQSCM International Advisory Board Member Xenia Cord will present, "A Whole New Light: The Significance of 20th Century Kits" on June 24 at 12 p.m.

Monday August 11, 2014 August Program Mary Johnson of HeartStrings Quilt Project Lecture: The Heartstrings Story

Mary (Mollie) Johnson is a self-taught quilter with a focus on blogging, designing, knitting and organizing the HeartStrings Quilt Project.

Heartstrings is an online group of quilters who have joined together to make and donate String Quilts to local charitable organizations. Members contribute to group quilts through donating blocks, assembling and quilting tops.

"The HeartStrings Quilt Project grew out of a casual exchange of postings to the Stashbuster Yahoo group in December 2006. Focused on using our fabric stashes, a number of us expressed interest in getting involved in making quilts to be donated to various charities. At first, it was intended to be a short term initiative, but the interest from members of the group was very strong, so the idea was enlarged to accommodate guilters of all levels of experience, living in different parts of the world, and making string guilts over an extended period of time. "

Class (Monday August 11, 2014): String Blocks

String Blocks are the foundation (no pun intended) for Heartstrings Quilts. In this class, we will learn how to make string blocks and how to use those scraps, strings, and bits of fabric we all seem to have leftover after making other guilt projects, from which we will create beautiful and comforting guilts to donate to causes near and dear to our hearts.

Mollie will share tips on how to create string blocks, assemble string blocks into quilts, and how to incorporate sashing into string block quilts. She will also share tips on how to organize strings and design our own string guilts

Supply list:

10 inch square foundations. Muslin or other 100% cotton foundations are acceptable. When using a foundation other than muslin make sure it's not going to shadow through your strings.

- 48 foundations will make an adult size lap quilt that is 54x72 inches
- 24 foundations will make a small child size guilt that is 36x54 which can be enlarged by adding a small border if desired. (con't on page 6)
