

The 2015 Lincoln Quilters Guild Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 was presented to Holly Zemke. Holly is pursuing her degree of Master of Arts in Textile History and Quilt Studies at the University of Nebraska, Lincoln. Holly's thesis project is red and green appliqué quilts. The scholarship will enable her to travel to Pennsylvania and North Carolina to document the regional differences of the guilts. 
