Peg's humorous narrative is bound to make the audience think back to their own guilt histories, successes and follies alike, with a smile.



The International Quilt Study Center & Museum is celebrating contemporary art quilts with a series of exhibitions this spring. The upcoming exhibits will feature works from regional, national and international artists

- "Art Quilts of the Midwest" Drawn from pieces featured in Linzee Kull McCray's book "Art Quilts of the Midwest," the quilts selected for this exhibition hint at the ways Midwestern geography, weather, people and culture influence regional artists. The show will run two segments, the first Jan. 5 March 5 and the second March 8 May 8.
- · "Man-Made: Contemporary Male Quilters" This traveling exhibition of 26 works from eight acclaimed artists will culminate at the IQSCM with a run Feb. 16 June 19. With backgrounds in contemporary visual art, media, and fashion, the eight artists featured in the exhibition—Joe Cunningham, Luke Haynes, Jimmy McBride, Aaron McIntosh, Dan Olfe, Joel Otterson, Shawn Quinlan, and Ben Venom—have been identified as significant contributors to the evolution of the quilting medium. This exhibition was organized by the Craft & Folk Art Museum in Los Angeles, California. Join the IQSCM on March 4 from 4:30-7 p.m. for the exhibit's opening reception, featuring a live performance from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's Bathtub Dogs at 5:30 p.m.
- · "Blue Echoes: Quilts by Shizuko Kuroha"

  Japanese artist Shizuko Kuroha's palette of antique indigo-dyed fabrics uses complex pattern and shading to create optical illusions that give her work a feeling of depth. Experience Kuroha's harmonies, atmospheric effects, and "blue echoes" in the first ever solo exhibition by a Japanese artist at the IQSCM March 4 May 25. The museum will hold the opening reception on Friday, April 1 from 4-7 p.m., featuring a talk from historian Teresa Wong at 4 p.m. and a lecture from the artist at 5:30 p.m.
- "Waypoint: Quilts by Maya Chaimovich" Israeli artist Maya Chaimovich had worked in woodcarving, jewelry, and several forms of fiber arts before discovering her passion for quilts. Her quilts, which have appeared in solo shows in England, France, Holland, Israel and the United States, will be on display at the IQSCM May 10 Aug. 7.
