# **Minutes of the Last Meeting**

### LINCOLN QUILTERS GUILD MEETING Monday, October 8, 2018 College View Seventh-Day Adventist Church

Pat Kant welcomed members to the October meeting of the Lincoln Quilters Guild. Three guests were asked to stand and be recognized and encouraged to consider joining the Guild.

Pat recognized the guild members who participated in the All-Female Veterans Life Flight event September 24. It was an honor for LQG to be part of an event celebrating the military service of women through Quilts of Valor.

Pat thanked members who registered quilts to be displayed at Threads Across Nebraska. Bonnie Kucera and Judy Edwards were thanked for transporting the quilts.

Pat congratulated LQG member Kris Vierra who authored a story, "How to Shop for a Longarm Quilting Machine", published in the November issue of the American Quilter.

### **Old Business**

 The minutes for the September, 2018 meeting were printed in the Plain Print. The Board corrected the minutes to read as follows: Kim Shelley made the following motions.
To modify the LQG By-Laws by removing Article 7, Section 4 entitled "Scholarship Committee".
To eliminate the line item in the LQG Budget for "Scholarship". Discussion followed. Since the motion involves a change in LQG Bylaws, it was decided that the LQG Board would discuss this proposal at their next meeting.

A correction in the President's Message in paragraph 2, second sentence regarding the Quilts of Valor Life Flight should read "It was an honor for LQG to be part of an event celebrating the military service of women through Quilts of Valor."

Pam Wakeman moved to approve the September Plain Print as amended. June Peterson seconded. Motion passed.

- 2. The September, 2018 Treasurer's report and the proposed 2018-2019 Budget were printed in the Plain Print. Mary Jane Kermmoade moved to approve the Treasurer's report. Dan Shelley seconded. Motion passed.
- 3. Pat indicated that we will be voting on the slate of officers for the 2018-2019 Guild year. Article V of the LQG By-laws specify that 8 officers will lead the Guild. Due to the lack of a nomination for the President-elect position, the Board voted not to assume the responsibility of the President-elect for 2018-19. Each position is essential to the successful management of the Guild's mission. Positions left vacant have consequences. The Board looks to the membership to support the Bylaws.
- 4. Amending the By-laws. Kim Shelly proposed the following motion at the September meeting: Article 7, Section 4 entitled "Scholarship Committee" will be removed. The motion was seconded by Martha Lane. After a discussion by many members, a written vote was held with the following results Yes—32 votes No—82 votes. The motion was not approved.

The speaker for September was Diane Pebley who spoke on "Fast Track to Quilt Design".


The meeting was adjourned for Show and Tell.
