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## Minutes of the Last Meeting

### LINCOLN QUILTERS GUILD MEETING

Monday, July 8, 2019

College View Seventh-Day Adventist Church

President Christina Chapman called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and welcomed everyone. Guests and new members were asked to stand to be recognized and thanked for their attendance.

#### **Old Business**

1. President Chapman asked for approval of the June, 2019 LQG meeting minutes which were published in the Plain Print. Mary Jane Kermmoade moved and Barb Brown seconded the motion to approve the minutes. All were in favor of approving minutes and none opposed.

2. There were no corrections offered to the April 2019 treasurer's report which will now be remanded for audit.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

President-elect Announcements – Lisa Burham

Flood relief update was provided. Several quilts made by guild members will be donated to victims of recent Nebraska flooding. The organizer has received over 300 quilts so far and their goal is 500. A car caravan will deliver quilts starting in Stuart and then head down to Lynch where people lost everything. Anyone who would like to donate a quilt of any size, new or used in good

condition, to the Nebraska Flood relief effort will need to bring your donation to the August guild meeting. Quilts should have a piece of paper pinned to the quilt with the size so they can be organized.

Cards and notes to the recipient attached to the quilt would be a lovely touch.

Members were reminded that the guild will be participating in the Isles garage sale again next year so as you start spring cleaning or finish a project be sure to set aside fabric to donate.

The guild has been invited to submit quilts for the Nebraska State Quilt Guild's annual quilt show in October. We've been asked to provide 7 large quilts (64 x 64 or larger) and 7 small quilts (anything less than 64 x 64). Since the event is in Kearney, the guild will line up a volunteer to take the quilts to Kearney and a volunteer to return them to Lincoln. #### IQM Liaison - Ann Hauder

As of July 1, the quilt museum has changed its name. It is now officially named the "International Quilt Museum" (IQM). This change was made in order to simplify and recognize what it is often called anyway.

One of the new exhibitions is DUALITIES: EMIKO TODA LOEB. Quilts are double-sided by definition, but in reality, there is generally a definite decorative top and a less important back. Emiko Toda Loeb's quilts are meant to be viewed freestanding from both sides. She uses a complex technique to sew two-sided Log Cabin blocks, and once assembled, they form two wholly different compositions. Come see the incredible artistry she achieves with two-sided Log Cabin blocks. July 5 – October 27.

The 6th Annual Friends of IQM Art Market will be held November 22-23, the week before Thanksgiving. There will be about 20 area artists selling their works and we will also have a Friends table. For the Friends table, we need a variety of artsy, quilt related items to be donated. One hundred percent of the proceeds from the sale of these items goes directly to the museum. Last year, because of your generosity, we were able to provide needed support to the

museum. This year, we need your help again. Please bring your donations to the IQM liaison table here at LQ meetings or take them directly to the museum. Thank you so much for your support.

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

