# **Minutes of the Last Meeting**

# <u>Lincoln Quilters Guild Meeting</u> Monday, March 14, 2022

• Connie Soucie, Guild president, opened the meeting and welcomed members and guests.

Connie introduced the officers of the Guild for 2022, the committee chairs and committee members who help the Guild achieve our mission through member and community engagement.

#### **Old Business**

1. The <u>Minutes of the November 2021 meeting</u> were included in the March Plain Print.

There were no changes, and the President declared the minutes approved as submitted.

- Included in the March Plain Print were <u>Treasurer's reports for the</u> <u>months of November 2021, December 2021, and January 2022.</u>
   There were no changes, the president will file the reports for further audit.
- The transition meeting of officers and committee members did not take place
  - The December 6 meeting was cancelled due to the president having two surgeries and a fall. The January 10 meeting was cancelled due to Covid.
  - The committees are comprised of many returning members, so they are already working. Packets from the planned transition meeting are available to pick-up tonight.
- Officers met in February for our transition and took care of several items
  - Officers from 2021 and 2022 reviewed and updated their role descriptions. These were three to five years old and are now current.
  - Brainstormed activities and events for 2022 2025.
  - 2022 will include:
    - March National Quilting Day & Isles Sale
    - June membership recognition at the IQM.
      - June is also the Omaha Guild Quilt Show.
      - July is NE State Quilt Guild Quilt Nebraska
      - October is NE State Quilt Guild Threads Across Nebraska.
    - October Silent Auction planned.
      - Volunteers needed for planning and execution of the Silent Auction. Sherry Taylor who led the 2021 auction will be a resource for the group.
      - If interested, contact Connie. We need to start planning now
  - 2023 will include the same things and our 50th Anniversary celebration.
    - If interested in helping to plan the 50th anniversary, please contact Lisa and she will collect the names of volunteers.
  - 2024 to be discussed
    - Many of the same items, but need to consider Quilt Show planning (2023 or 2024).
    - An email survey will be sent to membership within the next 2 weeks to collect ideas on what events the Guild should take on in 2023 and 2024 and to determine the willingness of Guild members to assume leadership roles in these events.

# • Quilts of Valor - Sara Kenny will speak

- Thanks to LQG for the generous support of Quilts of Valor.
- Funds have been spent on batting, backing and labels.
- Guild members have been very generous in sharing their time talent and quilting skills with QOV.
- 2021 Statistics
  - Nationally, approximately 30,000 quilts were awarded, this decrease was due to Covid.
  - In Nebraska, approximately 1,000 quilts were awarded.
    - About 50 were awarded in Lincoln which is amazing considering the venue at which most QOVs are awarded in Lincoln was such down for much of 2021.
- This has resulted in a huge backlog of QOV requests needing to be filled.
  - At the QOV table
    - Quilt kits, Block kits, Pillowcase kits
  - There is a huge need for volunteer longarmers please visit the QOV table if you can help.
- Thank you for your continued support for the courageous women and men who serve in the defense of our country.

## • International Quilt Museum Liaison - Sandy Hanson

- The "Modern Meets Modern" exhibit closes on March 19th.
- "Bedtime Stitches" closes on April 9th.
- The museum is open Tuesday through Saturday from 10am to 4pm each day.
- o All six exhibits at IQM are listed on the IQM Liaison table.
- Salley Mavor: "Bedtime Stitches" is in the Mary Ann Beavers Terrace Gallery. It is a series of sculptural embroideries celebrating the theme of children sleeping safe in their beds.
- This is the 25th Anniversary of the James family's donation of their collection that started the work for IQM. As part of that celebration, The Joanna Rose collection of red and white quilts has arrived in Lincoln and will be shown in four different exhibits through the coming year. The first one will open April 1.
- o April 1 will be the first First Friday IQM will be open.
- The next Tuesday Talk is March 22 at Noon in the Seminar Room.
   Sheila Green will present "Celebrate Quiltmaking." A trunk show will be presented with quilts and quilted garments spanning 40+ years the talk is free with museum admission.
