



Finding a quilting stencil to fit in a specific quilt is often frustrating. They are either too small or too large. The feather designs are beautiful but often times hard to locate the correct size. Here is a simple way to construct a feathered stencil. The different size teardrop depends on the size of stencil you need......

- 1. Make the "spine" or basic shape you need. It may be a scallop, a circle or even a heart.
- 2. Lay the teardrop template on the spine, adjusting it so point "A" rests on the spine and "B" meets the edge of the other teardrop.

3. Continue in this fashion until the spine is completly covered. You may have to adjust and "fudge" in order to get the ends to come out evenly.
