This slide show looks at the work of quiltmakers of the past who have ignored the rules and produced quilts with a visual surprise in each. The quilts are funny, they are bizarre and they give us a new view of how we define 'quilt'. The lecture is an expansion of a chapter in Quilt Digest III.

Barbara Brackman presents "Yipes, Stripes!". This is a workshop using striped fabrics to obtain unusual effects like the Kaleidoscope quilt, the twisted ribbon or an interwoven look. Participants will also use striped fabric to imitate traditional patchwork--especially useful in miniature or doll quilts. Workshop participants will design and piece a block or miniature quilt and come away with a new view of the neglected stripe.

Barbara Brackman will present a workshop on "Dating Quilts". A course on identification and dating of antique quilts using clues in pattern, fabric, quilting, etc.


