

### QUILTING BEE -- February 22, 1986:





- 1. If an error in block construction or placement has been made, it will not be discovered until at least half of the quilt is quilted.
- 2. If your children and spouse are away for an entire evening, leaving you five hours of uninterrupted peace in which to quilt, there will be a power failure. (Ever tried to quilt by candlelight?)
- 3. If you order by mail some quilting supply that you desperately need NOW, the UPS and/or the postal workers will go on strike.
- **4a.** If you run out of a certain fabric, you will need only enought to finish one more block.
- 4b. If you rush out to the store to get that little bit of fabric, you will be informed that the fabric is no longer in stock and that it will not be reordered because it is not being manufactured anymore.
- 4c. If you should happen to run across a remnant of that fabric in some out-of-the-way

- place, you will have neither money, nor checkbook, nor charge card on your person.

### FRIENDSHIP QUILT BLOCK

# 9-PATCH WITH 4-PATCH VARIATION (finished size 12½ x 12½)

Piece the small 4-patch block by alternating bright and black fabric of Block B. Repeat for the other small 4-patch blocks. Make sure the brightly colored fabric squares are in the lower left and upper right corner of each 4-patch. Piece a large Block A between two 4-patch blocks for the top  $\overline{third}$ . Piece 2 large A blocks on either side of a 4-patch blocks for the middle third. Piece a large Block A between the remaining two 4-patch blocks for the last third. Stitch the 3 strips together. the brightly colored fabric should form one long central diagonal and two short diagonals on either side.

Cut 4 large A blocks of Plain Black cotton

FRIENDSHIP BLOCK DUE AT THE JANUARY MEETING

Cut 10 small B blocks of plain black sotton

Cut 10 small B blocks of plain brightly coloned cotton

(use no more than 2 bright colors)

Add #" seam to each piece when cutting.


TREAT ALL FABRICS FOR COLORFASTNESS. It is essential that each fabric used be treated before piecing


