# PIECES FROM THE PRARIE

Our 1987 quilt show will be September 19 through October 2, 1987. The committee has established the following criteria:

- > Quilt may not have been shown previously in Nebraska [competition exempt]
- > Minimum size of 24" x 24"
- > You must have had a part in its construction
- > You must be a Guild member to exhibit

To help the committee determine the amount of space needed for displaying our quilts, we need to know if you plan to exhibit a quilt or wallhanging. If you did not indicate on the list passed at the February meeting, please call Carol Dunklau [435-0686] or Pam Haas (421-1446) by March 31, 1987 if you will have an item to exhibit and its approximate size. Because of increased membership in the Guild, we anticipate space for only 1 item permember.

It will be the individual exhibitor's responsibility to provide insurance coverage for her quilt. Please check with your insurance representative regarding your homeowner' policy—we have found that most quilts are already covered. This will avoid duplication of insurance coverage. Exhibitor forms will be available at the April meeting.

#### ESPIRIT QUILT COLLECTION

Take abus, walk, or run but do go see the Espirit Quilt Collection when you are in the SanFrancisco area. The quilts on permanent public display are the personal collection of over 200 antique quilts made by the Amish. The quilts have been available to the public for over 12 years and are displayed inthe Esprit office building in the waehouse'industrial' section of San Francisco. You are invited to take the self-guided tour any week day, nine to five, but it is suggested you call first to be certain the building is open. Quilt Digest I gives agreat overview of the collection and how it came to be.

#### FUND ESTABLISHED

an Harnsberger, President of Lincoln Quilters Guild 1975-76, died February , 1987. Jean was a noted quilt scholar and collector. She enjoyed every aspect of quilting and had a deep interest in the history of Nebraska Quilts and quilters. Jean was a loyal Guild member and often shared her knowledge and resources for Guild shows and programs. She was the author of the preface to the 1974 Sheldon Exhibit catalog Quilts From Nebraska Collections, wherein she said 'quilt making is an art form of quality and importance". In the introduction to the program for Preserving Nebraska's Heritage, at the Candy Factory, 1985, she spoke of the symbolism of quilt block titles 'to the rich past of the settlers' era".

Jean was very interested in the conservation and preservation of old quilts. She would often rescue old quilts and give them her special touches of repair and restoration and make them a part of her personal collection.

#### MAY FRIENDSHIP BLOCK


Trying something different for our Friendship Block in May, I decided to let all of you display some of your own creativity!!!

Please find your favorite HOUSE patterns and make sure they will finish out to  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " pieced, (12" finished). The only stipulation on color for this block ill be the backgrounds and sky should all have <u>UNBLEACHED MUSLIN</u>. Any color combination that you wish will be allowed. <u>Just remember the Unblaached muslin</u>.

This will be a fun way to incorporate your drafting techniques (if you don't already have a 12" house already to go). This is a scrap block, so HAVE FUN!!!
