

October 7 - Frankie Best will speak on the Nebraska Quilt Project.




QUILT SITTERS NEEDED

NEW NAME TAGS



HELPFUL HINT



To rid yourself of those tangled loose threads which tie your fabrics in knots when pre-washing, just clip a <u>small</u> triangle from each corner of the fabric before putting it into the wash. The cut on the bias keeps the fabric from unraveling between selvages. It works!

DIRECTIONS FOR ATTACHING SLEEVE TO YOUR QUILT

Choose a matching fabric or muslin for the sleeve. Cut the sleeve 9" x the width of the quilt. Fold in half lengthwise and stitch 1/2" seam allowance. turn right side out and turn back ends 1/2 to 3/4" and hem. Hand sew the sleeve at the top, right below the binding and then the bottom of the sleeve. If you plan to hang it at home a long time, you may want to sew through the batting and just catch the front. This avoid putting all the strain on the front of the fabric.




The quilts then hung in the NQA show in Easton, Pennsylvania. Dates of the show were June 24 - 28, 1987.



FRIENDSHIP BLOCK





Color and Fabric Choices:


- 1. Unbleached Muslin-Background

- 4. Use cottons




GENERAL DIRECTIONS:




