

I bought one of your patterns for the Crazy Quilt Top, at the Lincoln National Quilt Show. Your tops are very unique.

However, your pattern was a tremendous disappointment. It really is not a pattern, just a picture. It took my friend and I two and one half hours (5 woman hours) to trace the pictures of cach piece and measure quarter inch seam allowances! I thought I had bought a pattern. It is not a useable pattern because the one sheet is printed on both sides, and one cannot even cut out the pieces!!

After we had traced the pieces, added seam allowance, we had to cut out each piece. THEN we had a pattern!!

I will be extremely careful before I buy any other pattern such as yours. I will insist on the merchant opening the pattern to see what I am getting. \$6.50 is an expensive pattern, too much for what I received.
