

Finished yo-yos may be given to JoAnne Bair or Millie Fauquet. We would really appreciate your help.

(4" circle)

- 1. Make a template of this 4 inch circle Draw on the wrong side of the fabric and cut out.
- 2. Thread your needle with a double strand of thread.
- 3. Turn under a scant 1/4 inch seam, (just turn the raw edge under).
- 4. Using a running stitch sew along the edge.
- 5. Gather and pull tight to shape the yoyo. You will end up with about a 2 inch yo-yo.
- 6. Knot your thread.

Quiltin' at the Creek, 1995

The fifth annual "Quiltin' at the Creek" quilt exhibit will be on display during the entire month of June at Anna's Restaurant in Cedar Creek, Nebraska.

This year's feature is entitled "The Purple Connection," Participants in this project have been divided into groups of three, with each quilter helping to create three quilt tops, one for each member of their group, utilizing a variety of purple fabrics provided by Anna.

Also on display the opening day of the exhibit will be "Night Flight," a raffle quilt designed and made by Joan Biasucci. Tickets are currently available for purchase, with the proceeds donated to AirLifeLine, a national non-profit organization of pilots who provide transportation without charge to those in need of medical treatment. The drawing for this quilt will be held at Anna's at the close of business on Thursday, June 1, 1995.
