

Virginia A. Spiegel, Ph.D., will be showing her mixed media art quilts at the Governor's Mansion from May 9 to June 9, 2000. The quilts can be viewed at the Mansion, 1425 "H" Street, in Lincoln from 1:00 to 4:00 on Thursdays, or during public functions. There is no admission charge.

Spiegel is a full-time studio art quilter based in Nebraska City, NE. She was one of eleven Nebraska artists selected by the Nebraska Arts Council for participation in the Governor's Mansion Art Program based on submitted slides and resumes. Spiegel has had work juried into regional, national, and international exhibits. She will be the featured speaker at one of our guild programs next year.

Hemotology office reported that they use about 50 blankets a day and will appreciate lap or twin size quilts. Be sure to turn in registration forms for quilts you want in the show. Photos of your quilts will be taken at our next Guild meeting in May. Kathie Baumbach reported that there will be a Cancer Research table at the Quilt Show. There will be risk forms to fill out to help with early detection. Donations will be welcomed. The Executive Board approved that 10% of the Quilt Show auction money will go to "Every Women Matters" and 90% will go to programming. Connie Strope asked Guild members to help with security during the Quilt Show.

National Quilting Day Update



It was established by Federal Legislation in 1990 and is administered by Nebraska Health and Human Services. The purpose of the program is to improve access to Breast and Cervical Cancer screening services among women who do not have health insurance or are inadequately insured.

Clipboards will be passed around during the May meeting for hanging, take-down, white gloves, and greeters. Hanging of the quilts will be done on Wednesday, June 7th & 8th. By helping to hang quilts, you get an up-close look at the quilts! If you can't spend the entire day, come for what time you have

available. Both white gloving (gloves provided) and greeting are done during show hours. Two hour shifts are available, so be sure to sign up. These are opportunities for you to help with the quilt show and enjoy it at the same time.



Please use all cotton fabric that has been pre-washed.


Fabrics needed:
