Penny McMorris, producer and host of the PBS special "The Great American Quilt," will present a lecture entitled "Crazy Quilts: the Japanese Connection" in conjunction with the International Quilt Study Center exhibition "Reflections of the Exotic East in American Quilts." Ms. McMorris' lecture, which will explore the influence of Japanese art and design on late nineteenth-century Crazy quilts, will be held at the Sheldon Memorial Art Gallery at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln on Saturday, September 29, from 10:30 a.m. to noon.

The exhibition "Reflections of the Exotic East in American Quilts" will be held at the Lentz Center for Asian Culture at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln from September 16, 2001 to December 16, 2001. It will present a historical overview of the profound influence of Asian design on American quiltmaking by examining the use of Eastern motifs and materials in quilts made between 1800 and 1950. The exhibition will include beautiful examples of chintz quilts, Crazy quilts, hexagon mosaic quilts, and twentieth-century kit quilts, all of which help explain the connection between Asian art and design and American quilts. A catalog with an introductory essay, photographs, and quilt descriptions will be available.

An opening reception with refreshments will be held on Sunday, September 16 from 2 to 4 p.m. and will feature a gallery talk by the exhibition's curator. A lunchtime gallery talk given by the curator will also be held Wednesday, October 10 at noon.

"Reflections of the Exotic East in American Quilts" is sponsored by the International Quilt Study Center, the Lentz Center for Asian Culture, the Nebraska Humanities Council, and the National Endowment for the Humanities. Workshop News from Kathy Moore

On October 8 Sylvia Einstein will be coming from Belmont, Massachusetts to talk about commercially printed fabrics and their use in contemporary quilts. Sylvia made her first quilt in 1975 to celebrate the bicentennial of the United States. She has exhibited on four continents, appeared in numerous magazines, and lectures in the U.S. and Europe. Her workshop on Tuesday, October 9 will show you how to design quilts using big, bold prints and other unusual fabrics. You will work with kaleidoscope graph paper and pencils or magic markers. Then you will glue fabric scraps in an intuitive manner; and design and piece a wall hanging or quilt. The workshop will run from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and is suitable for all skill levels. Cost will be \$25.

Welcome to the LQG Freindship block exchange. This year we will be presenting a series of blocks which will start very simply and progress to a bit more challenging. We hope that newer quilters will be able to further develop their piecing skills and hopefully more experienced quilters will enjoy playing with some fun blocks they may not have tried yet. For each block we will give fabric selection guidance, so that the blocks should work well together, but hopefully many of us will have the fabrics in our scrap baskets.


September Friendship Block--"Stairsteps"

- --Use a navy solid and a plaid which contains navy and/or red.
- --Cut a strip of each fabric 2 1/2 inches by 19 inches (the cross grain of a fat quarter will work well).
- --Sew strips together lengthwise (width should now be 4 1/2 inches). -- Cut into four 4 1/2 inch units.



each unit will be 4 1/2" square (finishes to 4 inches)

Pin the four units together. Each four units will equal one friendship exchange. The block winners can them assemble the units into a stairstep pattern, as shown below for a scrappy plaid look
