On January 13 Vincent Quevedo from Lincoln, NE, will speak on "From Fibers to Fabric to Fantasy: Imagination Is All You Need," focusing on translating fabric to a three dimensional form using a myriad of traditional and contemporary techniques in manipulating fibers and fabric.

On February 10 Jo Morton from Nebraska City, NE, will present "Making Something New that Looks Old," sharing with us her love of 19<sup>th</sup> century quilts and how to make new quilts look old. On Saturday, February 15, Jo will teach a class on Strippy Stars, a quilt reminiscent of an early 19<sup>th</sup> century chintz strippy quilt, with discussions on fabric selections and neat piecing techniques.

On **March 10** Elsie Campbell from Dodge City, KS, will present "Innovations and Renovations: Scrap Quilts," presenting her view of what makes a successful scrap quilt and showing a selection of her own scrap quilts. No class.


