

# February Quilt Block

Finished Size - 6", unfinished 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ "... Bright Pink Heart on Black Back ground.

First cut background square 6  $\frac{1}{2}$  " of gray or black print tone on tone to read more as solid.



Trace heart of bold hot pink print, either add seam allowance and use traditional applique or use iron-on and use black thread to blanket stitch.

Use center dot to center on your block.

#### **Lincoln Quilters Guild Achievement Awards**

An organization such as LQG requires many volunteer hours to sustain its activities. Sandy Anderson, Kathi Kinnaman, and Connie Strope have formed a committee to formulate a program to recognize these members who give so much to the Guild. We thought there should be a more consistent method to recognize the efforts of individuals and groups toward the betterment of LQG. We also believe that this may bring to the forefront members who quietly go about helping with no thought of recognition, and perhaps breathe life into the spirit of volunteerism.

To this end, we have devised an award program to be implemented this year. The award process will begin with written nominations from the membership. Nominees must be members of LQG.

Very infrequently, a member is made a "life member". Previously, there have not been any guidelines to follow for such an award. Life Member is the highest honor given to an LQG member. It is given for a lifetime of achievement and significant contributions to the Guild. The recipient is no longer required to pay dues (unless they so desire), and their name will join the list of eleven previous recipients printed in the LQG membership book. They will also receive a pin to wear on their nametag, identifying them as an LQG Life Member.

The LQG Bright Star Award will be given to members for consistent achievement and effort toward the betterment of the Guild. The recipient will receive a pin to wear on their nametag, identifying them as an LQG Bright Star.

A nomination form for members to use will be available in the Plain Print each October, or from the members of the nominations committee. Nominations must be in writing, and will be evaluated on a point system. The deadline for receiving nominations will be February 1, with the awards ceremony taking place at the Guild's birthday party in March. Forms should be mailed to LQG Awards, PO Box 6861, Lincoln, NE 68506. Due to the lateness of this presentation, the deadline, for this year only, will be February 15.

"What qualities or contributions are we looking for?", you may ask.

Is this person the best organizer you have ever met? Does she promote our Guild and quilting in the community, or help children find the art of quilting? Do you just know that wonderful quilt is hers without asking? Does she agree to hold an office in Guild when asked, and serve on committees when needed? Let the Guild honor these people. It is our vision that nominations will be made with much thought and care to keep these awards at the prestigious level they deserve.
