

On Monday, March 11, Elsie Campbell from Dodge City, Kansas, will present "Innovations and Renovations: Scrap Quilts," her view of the processes that go into the planning and construction of scrap quilts. Elsie's quilts have appeared in many books and magazines, including Oxmoor House's Great American Quilts series and the Quilter's Newsletter Magazine, and have garnered many prestigious awards including Best of Show at Quilt America! 2000; the Mary Krickbaum Award for Best Hand Quilting, NQA Show, 2001; 1st place in the Professional Traditional Pieced category at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, Texas; and 1st place Best Use of Color, World Quilt and Textile Show 2002. In addition she is a free-lance writer for several magazines and has authored multiple chapters for Rodale Press's Successful Quilting Library.
