### OCTOBER MEETING LECTURE

October's LQG meeting will feature a lecture by Sherry Leftwich of Mc Louth, Kansas. Sherry has enjoyed sewing since her childhood 4-H days, but the craft took a new turn when she began putting small pieces of fabric together to create jackets and vests. These garments have sold in boutiques all over the country and two of her garments were selected to travel with the Hoffman Challenge. Sherry does trunk shows of 40-60 garments for quilt guilds and other groups and teaches at shops and conferences. She also has her own pattern line under the name "Thimble Boutique" which currently has eight patterns in print. Probably the most unique thing about Sherry's work is her supply list. She uses many of the items we keep around because they are too good to dispose of, but never wear. The hand-made closures on all her garments have become a "trademark item" and the most requested instructions in her classes. Sherry will conduct a Sweater Jacket class Monday, October 13, at the All Saints Lutheran Church in Lincoln from 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. The registration fee is \$25 and the deadline to register is September 29. ## 2003 Nebraska State Fair Quilt Show Awards



The LQG presented cash awards of \$25 to the following 2003 Nebraska State Fair Quilt Show exhibitors: Bonnie Miller of Papillion, Nebraska for her entry in the Best Wall Quilt category; Bea Bauerle of Champion, Nebraska for the Founder's Award; and Kellie Kachek of Ralston, Nebraska for her entry in the First Quilt category.

The Guild's "Discover Nebraska" quilt won fourth place in the Quilting Bee Wall Quilt category and the Guild's 2004 Quilt Show Raffle Quilt (designed and pieced by LQG member, Kate Laucomer, and quilted by LQG members) won first place in the Group Quilts category.

Congratulations to Sandi McMillan of Albion, Nebraska on winning the first annual Linda Mager Memorial State Fair Award. This award was established in remembrance of Linda, a past President of the LQG, and is given to an individual who incorporates a pig on the front of the quilt in the most creative way. Sandi's quilt entry included a pig with "attitude" and won a \$25 cash award. Linda was a great collector of pigs so the category is aptly named "Pig on a Quilt". 
## **VOLUNTEERING AT THE IQSC**



## **CUDDLE / ANGEL QUILTS**

Thirty-six Cuddle Quilts and 63 Angel Ouilts were delivered in June and July to all three city hospitals as well as six designated agencies in Lincoln. We are currently working on filling a



request from Cedars for 50 Cuddle Quilts. If you have any quilt tops or finished/unfinished cuddle quilts at home, please bring them in so we can share them with the children who need them.

Currently we have a large supply of the 12" to 15" Angel quilts on hand that are used for infants that are born at rest. The hospitals have recently requested 24" square quilts to present to the families of premature infants.

The next Cuddle Quilt workday will be Friday, October 10. Note that the workday is changed from the normal date (the first Friday) due to the Lincoln/Omaha Fall Quilt Retreat on October 3-

There will be a Cuddle Quilt tying workshop December 6 & 7, at the Back Porch located at 2710 North 48th Street in Lincoln. We are trying to build up our supply of quilt tops in preparation for this event so feel free to pick up a Cuddle Quilt top kit at the LQG Resource Room or at a monthly Guild meeting. Watch for more details about the workshop.

Call to Order: President Vicky Skuodas called the meeting to order.

- <u>Future classes</u>: Barb Clement announced that a board on the activity table features samples of future class projects. The October 13 class features Sherry Leftwich's sweater jacket.
- National Quilt Day: Donna Svoboda, Jane Barney, Sheila Green and Sandy Anderson are each making quilts to promote this event.

Mary Campbell Ghormley Reading Room: Sandy Anderson announced that a chairperson is needed for the Garage Sale planned for October 2004. Proceeds go to the MCGRR. Connie Strope announced that packets containing thirteen 6 ½" charm squares plus patterns will be available for \$2 each at the October meeting. Members were encouraged to use the charm squares to make a quilt for the June 2004 quilt show. Members can also contribute 6 ½" squares for this MCGRR fund raising project.

Resource Room: Jo Anne Bair announced that the University Place Art Center has hired a curator for the Gladys Lux doll collection and might need the space LQG is using as a Resource Room. Members can submit ideas of locations for a Resource Room to the Search Committee members: Jo Anne Bair, Sheila Green, Marilyn Rembolt and Vicky Skuodas.

By-Laws Changes: The Visions and Executive Committee from last year, and the Executive Committee from this year have proposed changes clarifying the language of the LQG By-Laws, which are posted on the web page. A few hard copies are available also. Vicky Skuodas noted changes: Article 3 will say the membership year run from June 1-May 31; Article 5 updates duties of the Treasurer Elect and Advisor and says all elected officers "shall" attend Executive Board meetings; Article 6 is changed to

reflect the differing terms of office; Article 7 will now include the Treasurer Elect and Advisor officers; Article 9 changes "workshops" to "classes." The vote on acceptance of the By-Law changes will take place at the October meeting.

Friendship Block Exchange: Cheryl Jonas handed out 5 groups of 10-11 friendship blocks to Carolyn Bowman, Gyla Bowden, Dorothy Otoupal, and Judy Edwards. Next month's block pattern is available, and should be completed using Civil War fabrics.

ilt Show: Kim Shelley provided information about "Grandma's Legacy and Beyond," the 2004 LQG biennial quilt show to be held at Lux Middle School. It will take place June 11 from 10am-8pm, June 12 from 10am-6pm and June 13 from Noon-6pm. The live auction will take place June 13 at 2 pm. Packets of raffle tickets are available. Chairs are still needed for youth activities, demonstrations, speakers, and vendors. Instructions are available for the "Grand Mothers" Challenge, an opportunity to make a quilt to honor an important woman in a member's life.

Cuddle Quilts: Anita Ahrens asked small groups to donate plastic bins to store Cuddle Quilt material at the Resource Room. The next workday will be October 10 from 10am-4pm. Fabric kits are available for members to take home and sew. Eight cuddle quilts were turned in tonight, and Jean Ang won the drawing for flannel fat quarters. Hospitals are asking for slightly larger Angel Quilts – 24" square - to send home with premature infants.

LQG Raffle Quilt: Judy Lutgen is the Raffle Quilt Travel Agent, or "Mom." The quilt was pieced by Kate Laucomer, pieced by LQG members, and bound by Vicky Skuodas. At the State Fair, it was selected "Best Quilt Made by More than Two People: and as "Best Group Quilt" from Bemina Sewing Studio/Lopers Sewing. Several shops have already agreed to display the raffle quilt: Creative Hands, Hooper Creek, The Back Porch and Karen's Country Gifts & Fabric Center in Lincoln; Common Threads, Syracuse; Countryside Fabrics, York; Calico Cottage, Hastings; Quilted Moose, Gretna, Fabric Fair, Seward; Vogies Quilts & Treasures, Dodge; and Log Cabin Quilt Shop, Omaha. ## LQG BOOK/MAGAZINE SALE



# The 2004 LQG Quilt Show "Grand Mothers" Challenge

Each member of the Lincoln Quilters Guild has been positively influenced by an important woman in their life - a Mother, Grandmother, Teacher, Neighbor, Friend, etc. The "Grand Mothers" challenge is an opportunity for us to honor these women through the art of quilting. Participation is optional.

#### Challenge Category Rules:

- Any LQG member, at any quilting level, is welcome to participate in the challenge.
- The quilt will somehow represent the theme according to the vision of the quilter.
- The quilt should be all hanging size and may be any shape. Total outside measurements of the quilt should be no less that 48" and no more than 180."
- Quilts may <u>not</u> be tied. Embellishments are acceptable.
- Quilt must have a 4" sleeve on the back (sleeve may be smaller if quilt is extremely small).
- Quilt must have an identification label on the bottom, back corner containing the following information: Quilter's Name, Address, and the Title of the Quilt.
- 7. When turned in, the quilt must be in a cloth bag identifying the name, address and telephone number of the quilter. The quilt must be accompanied by a registration form, which includes a short description of the inspiration/interpretation of the theme that led to the creation of the quilt.
- Challenge quilts must be dropped off at the designated quilt drop-off locations during designated drop-off hours (drop-off location sand times are yet to be determined. They will be announced later).
- The Challenge Quilts will be hung together at the 2004 LQG Quilt Show.

Use "Civil War" era prints or the like. For interest, change prints in a couple of the A Block pieces. This will give a scrappy look to the quilt.


A Blocks: 2 1/2" bias square. Color 1: Dark or medium brown tone print


