OCTOBER MEETING LECTURE

November's LQG meeting will feature a lecture by Paulette Peters of Elkhorn, Nebraska. Paulette is a passionate quilter. She began quilting in the late 70's because of the connection that quilting provides with generations of women's history and art. Her family had no quilters, so this was a new experience for her. She has forged wonderful friendships and shared interests with not only with her own generation, but with the new quilters who are discovering quilting now.

Paulette has taught quiltmaking on the national level, designed numerous fund-raising quilts, and written four quilting books. She quilts almost every day and finds it to be a great means of expression. She pieces, appliqués and quilts either by hand or machine, using the most appropriate method for the piece. She classifies herself as a contemporary quilter... part traditional, part innovative and likes to express an idea or record an experience in her quilts.

International Quilt Study Center Launches Online Image Database & New Website

The International Quilt Study Center is pleased to announce the launch of its new website and online image database that allows anyone, anytime, anywhere to search its extensive quilt collections.

Go to the IQSC website and link directly to the database of more than 1200 guilts, viewing detailed information about each quilt as well as fullcolor images. You can search by pattern name, quiltmaker, location of origin, date, and predominant technique, among others. For those who are unable to attend one of the IQSC's many local and traveling quilt exhibitions, users are also able to search the database by exhibition name, creating a virtual quilt gallery on their computer screen. Another highlight is the ability to search by collection name; for instance, viewing all of the quilts in the 930-piece Ardis and Robert James Collection, the 156-piece Robert and Helen Cargo African-American Quilt Collection, or the 90-piece Sara Miller Amish Crib Quilt Collection. The IQSC also looks forward to adding the newlyacquired 400-piece Jonathan Holstein Quilt Collection to the database in the coming year.

The newly redesigned IQSC website features an updated look and new information, as well as old favorites such as the Quilt of the Month program, and an e-mail subscription service for keeping in touch with the IQSC's collections, exhibitions and public events. The new website retains the IQSC's current web address, http://quiltstudy.unl.edu.

JANUARY CLASS INFORMATION



January's "Creating a Scene" class will be taught by Lois Wilson on Monday, January 12, from 9 AM - 4 PM, at the

All Saints Lutheran Church located at 8251 Pioneers.

The six-hour class will be based on Gai Perry's book, Impressionist Quilts. The book will be a requirement for the class. You may want to wait to buy the book until after the pre-session. Gai Perry's method uses 2 1/4" squares set on point to create a landscape or still life. The day will be spent cutting squares and "playing" with your fabric at the design wall to create the scene of your choice. I find it easiest to use a photograph, picture from a magazine, card or painting as a guide.

A pre-class session will be held at 7:00 p.m., on Tuesday, November 18, 2003 at the Bess Dodson Walt Library located at 6701 South 14th Street. Note: 14th Street may be closed at Old Cheney, but should be open to the north from Pine Lake Road. This 1 to 1 ½ hour pre-session will be a time to share with students the types of scenes that are possible and suggestions for fabrics that will "do the work" for you. Students will also receive a supply list needed for the class.

A time for a follow up session will be scheduled during the January 12, class. Please feel free to call Lois at 328-8185 or bring your questions to the pre-session.

MINUTES OF THE LINCOLN QUILTERS GUILD

October 13, 2003 - 7:00 pm College View Seventh-Day Adventist Church Lincoln, Nebraska

President Vicky Skuodas welcomed everyone and introduced Vice President Barb Clement. Barb introduced guest speaker Sherry Leftwich of McLouth, Kansas. Sherry conducted a Sweater Jacket class October 13. The program featured a trunk show of vests and sweater jackets designed by Sherry.

A five-minute break was held to provide an opportunity to sign up for a possible Tuesday morning class with Sherry on making handmade closures, fitting vests, etc. Because only four people signed up, it was decided not to hold this optional class.

Call to Order: President Vicky Skuodas called the meeting to order.


