### Quilt Show 2004 Wrap-Up

When I used to look at quilts, I thought, "Wow, that's neat." Then, when I actually started quilting, I came to a much fuller appreciation of the time, effort, and creativity that go into the making of a quilt. The same is true of quilt shows. I have been to a lot of them, but I didn't comprehend what went into the creation of a show until I chaired "Grandma's Legacy and Beyond."

"Grandma's Legacy and Beyond," Quilt Show 2004, has now become part of the legacy of the Lincoln Quilters Guild. I extend my thanks to the Guild for entrusting me with chairing this wonderful event. Also, I thank the numerous guild members who contributed their quilts, their time, and their sweat (literally!) to make this show the success that it was.

With approximately 2,000 attendees, the quilt show and auction raised approximately \$9,700 for LQG. The winner of the raffle quilt, "Grandma's Legacy," was Joan Workman of Omaha, Nebraska. Winners of the Viewer's Choice voting were Marilyn Rembolt (Grand Mothers Challenge) for "Grandma Hope" and Berniece Jeffries (Other Quilts in Show) for "Wildflower Wonders."

Committee chairs met in July and have numerous suggestions to make Quilt Show 2006 an even better part of the growing LQG legacy. Now that the show is over, all I can hope is that each person who attended the show went away thinking, "Wow! That was neat!" --Kimberly Shelley

### SEPTEMBER MEETING LECTURE

"Trunk Show" by Sally Collins of Walnut Creek, California

Sally Collins loves the challenge of combining quality workmanship and intricate piecing in a traditional style.

She travels frequently, sharing quilts and teaching workshops across the country. Join Sally for a fun, informal and informative evening as she shares over 25 quilts in a chronological order while explaining how she works, describes some of the problems she encountered and how she approached correcting them. This is her most popular presentation; questions and cameras are always welcome.

September 14 Class: "Pieced Baskets" in small scale with Sally Collins

This 6 hour class will focus on precision sewing, quality workmanship and multiple half-square triangle techniques to create a lovely basket block in two different sizes (1-7/8" and 3-1/8").

Students can choose either one or both sizes, depending on their skill level. A handout for the complete 12 block quilt is included. Class time is spent between lecture, explanation, demonstration and student sewing time. If you are interested in improving your sewing skills, this is the class for you. Garage Sale items wanted:

Quilting and sewing related items: quilt tops, blocks, UFOs, fabric, quilting books, quilting magazines, patterns, threads, notions, sewing tools, etc

Craft items: Paints, brushes, beads, sequins, laces, etc. Many scout troop leaders, pre-school personnel and Sunday school teachers look for craft items for child-age projects.

Small appliances: items that you might have in a sewing area. For example, lights, chairs, tables, radios, etc. Note: if one person alone cannot move it, it is too big, and we cannot use it. Clothing: is discouraged unless it is a quilt or sewing related item such as a decorated sweatshirt or other clothing item (for sewing or a holiday)

Knick-knacks and various home decorating items, holiday décor, etc are acceptable Baked items: such as a dozen rolls, kolaches, cookies or brownies on a paper plate, covered in plastic wrap. Please individually wrap rice krispie bars, popcorn balls or large cookies. Items NOT WANTED: No livestock. If it eats, breathes or breeds it is livestock.

No firearms, ammo, fireworks or explosives.

There will be a signup sheet distributed in Sept for work times.

We will also need your banquet tables, and drying racks for displays. Please let me know if you have a table or rack that we can use for the sale.
