#### OCTOBER LECTURE AND CLASS

JoAnn Belling Quilt Artist and Teacher

Quilting classes and lectures, specializing in color and design.

JoAnn is from the Des Moines, Iowa area. She has enjoyed the sewing machine since she began producing her own clothes at age twelve. In 1965 she began quilting with heavy polyester fabrics and no formal instruction. Encouraged by a friend, she enrolled in classes in 1977 and has designed numerous quits and wall hangings. She has taught a variety of classis in United States and Japan. Her influence in quilting has been felt from coast to coast. The Belling household has hosted a number of quilt groups for lectures and tours. Her finest work has been reproduced in national publications.

Concepts of color and composition which JoAnn uses in her photographic art are applied to the designing of quilts, borders and quilt back-art. She enjoys all phases of quilting, but of greatest interest are the color and design portion.

JoAnn will be teaching Basic Colorwash. This is a beginning class that has been very well received wherever it has been taught. JoAnn has several ColorWash quilts and wall hangings completed. By using squares, learn how to read and see color and density and arrange the delicate shadings to produce an overall effect. Since Color and Design are her first enjoyment, you will benefit from the new way to look at possibilities in every fabric. It is a lively class and has always filled promptly.

The lecture/trunk show will be on October 11 and the class "Basic Colorwash" will be on October 14. This will be held at All Saint's Lutheran at 81<sup>st</sup> and Pioneer. Please have your registration along with a SASE to Cindy Weyers by October 8<sup>th</sup>.
