




## May Friendship Block MAY BASKET 8" Block

You will need 3 fabrics. A background, and inner basket and the basket handle. I used floral for basket and handle. You creative ones can add flowers to the basket or rickrack, etc., etc.

- Cut A 2- 3 ½" x 4" background (light) B 1- 2 ½" x 5 ½" handle (medium) C 2- 2 ½" x 3 ½" inner basket (dark) D 1- 3 ½" x 8 ½" basket (medium) E 1- 1 7/8" square of background, cut once on the diagonal Stitch A to C along 3" sides. Make two A/C units
- A/C to B on left side A/C to B on right side. Square up to  $5 \frac{1}{2} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ A/B/C unit to D along the  $8 \frac{1}{2}$  side as shown

Stitch E 🖉 to two corners of basket bottom. Square up to 8 1/2"

## Quilt Exhibition Points to Early Political Activism by Women

What: *Partisan Pieces: Quilts of Patriotic and Political Persuasion* An exhibition of selected quilts from the collections of the International Quilt Study Center, University of Nebraska-Lincoln

*Partisan Pieces: Quilts of Patriotic and Political Persuasion*, an exhibition of quilts with political and patriotic themes, will be on view at the Robert Hillestad Textile Gallery June 3—August 31, 2005. The exhibition, which includes approximately 17 quilts from the International Quilt Study Center's Ardis and Robert James Collection,


explores how war, politics, and political candidates impacted the choices nineteenth- and early twentiethcentury American women made in their quilting designs. There will be a variety of examples of the "Whig Rose" pattern, also known as the "Democrat Rose." These red and green appliqué quilts are outstanding examples of technical skill and early innovative design put to a partisan purpose. Patriotic quilts using stars, flags, federal eagles, campaign ribbons and kerchiefs will round out the display. All the quilts in this exhibition are visual reminders of a time when women had no public forum. Against all odds these quilts survive to give us evocative insights into the ways American women expressed political and patriotic sentiments during an era when they could not vote.

The exhibition will open on June 3, 2005, in the Robert Hillestad Textiles Gallery, second floor of the Home Economics Building on the East Campus of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and will be on display until August 31, 2005. Special events associated with this exhibition will include:

- June 9, Thursday, 5:00 p.m.—Public lecture by G. Julie Powell, connoisseur, certified appraiser and author on patriotic textiles and quilts


