- The Mary Ann Beavers Terrace Gallery has hung a new show of “Faces” by Freddy Moran. It will be up through November 16, 2022. In addition, Freddy will give a presentation on August 9 from 3-4 p.m. that is open to the public.
 - The Peg Coryell Gallery has “From the Studio: An Evolving Vision from the James Collection.” These Quilts will be up through October 12, 2022.
 - Remaining in the Doris Von Seggern Gallery is the “Evolving Vision: Classics” quilt display, including the Reconciliation quilt. This show will remain through October 12, 2022.
 - The Lois Ann Gottsch Gallery has “An Evolving Vision: New Horizons” quilts from foreign countries and will be up through October 29, 2022.
 - The West Gallery continues showing the “Red and White Quilts” from the Joanna Rose Collection and will be hanging through September 10, 2022.
 - On the main floor the small gallery continues Joan Schulze’s Winter of Lace through November 5, 2022.
 - The First Friday on September 2nd will feature Barbara Brackman. Reminder, First Friday is free admission to all and runs from 4:00 to 6:30 p.m. The upcoming show of quilts from Carolyn Mazloomi’s collection will be opening on October 21 with First Friday on November 4, 2022, featuring her items. This exhibit “Uncovering Black History” will be in all three single galleries and be up through March 25, 2023.

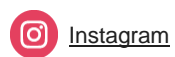
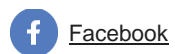
Nancy thanked Dana for her interesting presentation and story, and for showing us her work!
