LINCOLN QUILTERS GUILD MEETING MINUTES Monday, July 14, 2025, at 7:00 pm SDA Church, Lincoln, NE

President Vicky Skuodas called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Minutes from the June 8, 2025 Guild meeting were published in the Plain Print. Member Carol Curtis moved to approve the minutes and member Barb Brown seconded. The minutes were approved.

The Treasurer's report was also published in the June 2025 Plain Print newsletter. Jaynee Wolfe moved to approve the report. Dana Atteberry seconded. The Treasurer's report was approved and is remanded for audit.

President-elect Liane Connelly gave the following announcements:

- The Newbies Group will meet Monday, July 21st at Walt Library from 6-7:45 pm.
- On Give to Lincoln Day, the Guild received \$1797.77.
- The Guild Quilt Show is scheduled for October 25th. This is a free show, at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church located at 6001 A St., across from Pius H. S. Entry forms will be coming out soon, so consider your show entry for this fall event.
- There are still some sewing machines listed for sale in the Plain Print.
- There will be a Challenge for March of next year. The size will be 25-30" on each side and should answer the question "What does _____ mean to me?". Examples of answers may be: country, the flag, patriotism, etc.
- Liane also reported that the fund-raising concert for Sleep In Heavenly Peace made \$90,000. There are plans to build 200 beds in September.
- Guild Awards are due on September 1st. Guidelines are listed on the website. Please consider nominating a worthy Guild member.
- Vicky reminded the audience about the Bicentennial quilt made by the Lincoln Quilt Guild, which was shown in the June Plain Print. It won national attention and has many quilted representations of Nebraska. It resides at the Quilt Museum.
- Advisor Tammy Hensley is a graphic designer and presented her design of 250 star blocks for the 250th anniversary of our country. It is titled Semi Quilt Centennial! There are 16 different star patterns and the hope is that each Guild member will make 2-3 blocks in red, white, and blue! Off white, cream, and tan should NOT be used. The pattern will be available as a PDF on the Guild website. Members are encouraged to print the block patterns they wish to make. The block should measure 6 ½" and will finish at 6". This will be the Guild raffle quilt for 2026, with the proceeds to be donated to a Veteran's organization. Any extra blocks may be made into smaller wall-hangings and used for raffles or prizes. Some block patterns were printed and available. Several blocks were made and on display.

Vicky also reported that \$10,000 in Guild funds were placed into a CD, which allows the Guild access to withdrawal without penalty.

Vicky thanked Sue Dewitt for her transfer of funds last year with the new accounting software called Money Minder. She also thanked current Treasurers Nancy Gerdes and Barb Jauken for

their work this year in using the new software and all their efforts on behalf of the Guild.

Vicky again asked members if there was a mother/daughter who had attended the May Guild meeting. The speakers had left scraps for them, but they have yet to be identified.

Visitors were welcomed and asked to identify themselves. They received a door prize. If the visitor attended by invitation from a Guild member, the member also received a door prize! Members were also able to welcome new member Connie Jones!

Mini-Raffle - Natalie Cummings announced the prizes and winners:

- Irene Calburn donated a blue pinwheel wall hanging, which was won by Pam Wakeman.
- Lois Wilson donated a sewing kit, which was won by Caroline Forstrom.
- Kathy Miller and Anonymous donated a bag and pattern, which was won by Deb Hartford.
- Anonymous donated 10" squares ruler, which was won by Joyce Pope.

The Christmas In July basket was donated by Friends of LQG, LMQG, Wahoo Crazy Quilters, and private individuals. Sonia Sherman was the winner.

\$263.06 was collected for the Mini Raffle, of which \$186.00 was collected for chances on the Christmas in July basket.

Ann Hauder, introduced speaker Nina Clotfelter, from Mobile, Alabama. Nina's program was titled: Thread—What's the Big Deal?! Nina gave a lot of useful information about different kinds and types of threads and how best to use them. Her slides really illustrated the information she shared. She also encouraged those present to take her workshop the next day!

After the program, the meeting was adjourned to show and tell.
