### Rules, Regulations and Information

1. In order to enter an item, you must be a member of Lincoln Quilters Guild. Exception: Special request by Quilt Show Committee.
2. Limit of 4 items per member. Exception: Series Quilt.
3. Items must not have been shown in a previous Lincoln Quilters Guild show.
4. Each item entered must have its own entry form. Entry forms may be photocopied.
5. Each quilt (crib -- king size) must have a 4 inch sleeve on the back for hanging. All small quilts must also have a sleeve for hanging, approximately 2 inches in width.
6. All items are to be finished or completed projects.
7. All quilted items must have your name label sewn on the back. All pieces of wearable art and dolls must also have your name label sewn on them.
8. Each quilted item must be enclosed in a FABRIC BAG (or pillowcase) with your name, address and phone number written on the bag with a permanent pen/marker. A piece of paper or tape will not be accepted.
9. Dolls must be in a box with a lid. Your name, address, phone number and the doll's name must be written on the outside of the box.
10. Insurance for all items entered will be the responsibility of the exhibitor! Check with your insurance representative.
11. **VIEWERS CHOICE AWARDS:** There will be 6 categories -- Quilts (crib - King size), Wallhangings, Wearable Art, Dolls, Healing Quilts and Closet Cleaner Challenge. There will be 3 awards for each category.
12. All entry forms must be submitted no later than the May Guild meeting (Monday, May

**Special Quilt Display: "Healing Quilts"**

Quilting is therapy for many quilters. It is the calm that keeps us focused. It is the way we respond to stress, illness, trauma and life-changing events. Quilts, simple or complex, provide a way for quilters to express themselves, and identify and work through grief, shock, disbelief and mourning. The devastating events of September 11th have affected all of us, and as a follow-up to our Pink Quilt Challenge for Breast Cancer Awareness, the Lincoln Quilters Guild will be having a Special Quilt Display as part of Quilt Show 2002. The display will feature "Healing Quilts --- Quilts Made by Quilters as Therapy."

**Requirements:**

1. Anyone ...at any quilting level is welcome to participate in the display.
2. The quilt must be no less than 48 inches around the outside perimeter. There is no maximum size but quilts larger than a full-size bed will be included based on available display area.
3. The quilt must somehow represent the theme according to the vision of the quilter. The quilter is asked to provide an explanation of how the quilt represents the theme. Include a short written description of the inspiration/interpretation of the theme that led to your creation on the registration form.
4. Quilts may be pieced, appliqued or a combination of techniques. They may be hand or machine quilted. The quilt may not be tied. Embellishments are acceptable.
5. Add a 4" sleeve to the top back for hanging. A 2" wide sleeve is acceptable for small quilts.
6. Each item displayed must have its own registration form. Forms are available at guild meetings and will be printed in the Plain Print. Forms may also be printed from the guild web site at <http://lqg.tripod.com> (alternate Web access at: <http://members.tripod.com/~LQG/index.htm>). Entry forms may be photocopied.
6. Identify the quilt on the bottom back corner with your name and title of the quilt. Each item must be enclosed in a FABRIC BAG with your name, address and phone number on the bag. Please use a PERMANENT PEN on the bag or pillowcase. A piece of paper or tape will not be accepted. The special display quilts will be hung during LQG Quilt Show 2002. Quilts for the display will be received at each monthly meeting prior to the quilt show or may be delivered to committee member's homes by arrangement. In addition, dates and times for delivering your "Healing Quilt" to the quilt show site will be announced prior to the quilt show.
7. Quilts will not be judged and there will be no monetary prizes. Quilts will receive awards according to Viewer's Choice ballot.

Quilt Show information will all be on display during Guild meetings in the hallway that runs around behind the meeting room. Be sure to stop by and check it out. Registration forms are available online and can be downloaded for your use.

All members of LQG are invited to enter items for display at the show. There will be 6 categories of entries -- Quilts (crib to King size bed quilts) Wallhangings, Clothing/Wearable Art and Dolls. There are also two special categories -- the Healing Quilts and the Closet Cleaner Challenge projects. The guidelines for these 2 categories are found elsewhere in this issue of the Plain Print. The theme of the entries does not have to be safari related.

Everyone is encouraged to submit their registration forms as soon as possible. Forms can be turned in at Guild meetings or mailed to Pat Hackley at 3235 S. 28th St. Lincoln, NE 68502-5108. The sooner registration forms are turned in, the sooner the Committee can start typing up display tags. Be sure to include a short narrative about the item -- what inspired you to make it, why you won't ever make another one, etc.

Elsewhere in this issue of Plain Print you will find some volunteer opportunities to sit with the quilt and help sell raffle tickets, please consider helping out. Also, please remember to turn in your money or unsold tickets at Guild meetings -- only 2 more meetings until the show!

Thanks to all of you who have already volunteered to help in various ways with the show. That's what it takes to make a successful show. The Committee has a few more volunteer opportunities available:

1. Anyone who does machine embroidery to help make award ribbons -- with 6 categories we will need lots of ribbons.
2. Anyone who has sturdy green plants that they would be willing to loan for display during the show.
3. Someone to post signs along the streets to direct people to the show. Lux is a wonderful setting but not the easiest place to find.

## Scarlet and Cream: an Exhibition of Red and White Quilts from the IQSC

Join the IQSC's International Advisory Board members at the opening reception for "Scarlet & Cream," an exhibition of red and white quilts in the Hillestad Gallery of the Home Economics building on East Campus on June 7<sup>th</sup>, from 5:00 – 6:00pm. Welcoming remarks will begin at 5:15pm. The exhibition, featuring the UNL's school colors, marks the fifth anniversary of the founding of the IQSC at the University of Nebraska.

The exhibition will feature traditional patchwork quilts like Log Cabin and Star patterns as well as unique quilts that include a redwork embroidered quilt top with patriotic World War I sentiments and a contemporary quilt by folk artist Yvonne Wells. Also on view will be a red and white signature quilt with a University of Nebraska insignia and names of Nebraska alums who were members of the Palladian Society, a UNL literary society formed in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century. The quilt commemorated the beginning of a mission to India for a society member, Harriet Wyman Wilder, in 1921. A minister in California, who received the quilt as a donation for his church's Rummage-O-Rama, felt the quilt should be returned to Nebraska, and donated it to the University.

Mary Ellen Ducey, UNL archivist, will talk about the Palladian Society, at the IQSC Tuesday Talk, August 20, 2002 at noon in the Hillestad Gallery. On June 11, 2002, join curator Carolyn Ducey at 3:15 for a tour of the exhibition.





**Steppin' Out Block Directions:** Select dark fabrics for the shoe, and a light background for good contrast. When you flip the sewn fabric for patch 6, its placement may surprise you. To avoid this surprise: cut a strip 8" x 7" from the light print. Cut this strip as shown in the figure on the left. The larger section will be the top left of the block itself. Cut a strip 1 3/4" x 22" from the background fabric. This will border the block on the right, left and bottom & finish to 1" additional. (A little extra included which can be trimmed later.)

Start with piece #1, and notice the variety of heel styles indicated by the colored lines. For each block, choose the one you want and position fabric for patch 1 to extend at least 1/4" beyond the appropriate line. Then sew along that line when adding patch 2. Add patch 3, 4, and 5. Add patch 6, then the border to the right, left, and bottom of the block (borders are not shown in this newsletter for space reasons). The block should finish to 6 1/2" x 9".
